Background



In 2017, TDA funded the Conceptual Plan with 15 miles of land and 15 mile of water trails.

- Randolph County doesn't have a Parks and Recreation program. Depend on the eight municipalities to provide.
- Randolph County Tourism
 Development Authority (TDA)
 chose the Deep River corridor
 as an Initiative area in 1998.

 Worked to have it designated a State Trail in 2007.
- Franklinville, Randleman and Ramseur began constructing trails. TDA set up Task Force to coordinate efforts in 2015.

Funding





- Randolph County put together a Strategic Plan in 2016 in which Trails were mentioned in
 - Health/Wellness
 - Economic Development
 - Quality of Life
- In 2017 created a Strategic Planning Implementation Fund (RCSPIF) and funded the #1 priority preliminary engineering study for the Sandy Creek bridge connecting Franklinville to Ramseur.

Funding







- In 2019, created a Trails
 Coordinator position as part of the County Wellness Program.
- Trails Advisory Council with reps from the eight municipalities, TDA, Piedmont Legacy Trails, Uwharrie TrailBlazers and other trail associated groups.
- Received County SPIF monies for Sandy Creek Bridge construction, Seagrove sidewalks and Creekside Greenway bridge.

Recreational Trail Program







- Since DRST municipalities struggled with cash flow for RTP grants which are on a reimbursement basis, the County agreed to make application and administer RTP projects.
- Worthville to Central Falls Paddleway.
 - Randleman Deep River Greenway Phase III
- Sandy Creek Bridge construction





COVID 19 Pandemic

- Bright spot was five miles of trails along Deep River for family and friends to have a safe place to go outdoors.
- Increased DRST usage reached between 200% and 300%.
- Trails are no longer "nice" amenity; essential to not only physical but also mental, emotional and spiritual health and wellness.



COVID 19 Response

- Although the DRST had 5 miles of constructed trails, the segments were in three municipalities.
- To assist people in finding the segments, in 2020 the County worked with the Piedmont Legacy Trails to design a DRST Brochure and the TDA to print and distribute it to visitors center statewide.






COVID 19 Response

- In addition, the City of Asheboro worked with the other three municipalities to design the DRST logo and produce 27 trailheads and directional signs.
- The DRST Brochure and Signage were celebrated before Labor Day 2020.
- All three State legislators, two County Commissioners, the four mayors along with TDA, PLT and State Trails celebrated all three sites.

Deep River State Trail

\$1 million Request for County ARP Funds





- To address demand for trails that provide safe places for exercise and peace of mind, need to invest in more trail construction.
- In 2021 requested \$1 million in ARP funds for "investment ready" DRST projects.
- Most have matching funds to stretch County funds by leveraging \$400,000.
- Later switched to Strategic Planning Implementation Fund to allow more flexibility.







- <u>DRST Partner</u> Every State Trail is required to have a nonprofit partner. Piedmont Land Conservancy which has protected land on Deep River and in Randolph County agreed to be the DRST Partner.
- Complete the Trail Funds As the DRST Partner, PLC administers the Complete the Trail Fund grants including the Capacity Building Grant
- <u>Capacity Building Grant</u> Each State Trail receives \$49,500 for two years
 - Trail Coordinator \$20,000 per year
 - Maps \$2,750
 - Adm \$5,750
- DRST Coordinator PLC is contracting with Randolph County.








Randolph County \$1 Million

Sandy Creek Pedestrian Bridge





- Top priority of DRST Conceptual Plan
- Connect Franklinville (1.75 mi/Faith Rock .75 mi) to Ramseur (.75 mi) near US 64 bridge for total of 2.5 mi
- Total Cost \$400,000 with \$100,000 RTP grant
- Mattern & Craig Engineers have completed bridge and trail alignment and preliminary design.
- Projected Opening Dec 2023


Preliminary Engineering for Bridges



- Conceptual Plan calls for 19 stream crossings with at least five major bridges requiring preliminary engineering reports (PERs) similar to Sandy Creek Bridge.
- Have contract with Wetherill Engineering starting with Bush Creek on the Franklinville to Cedar Falls Section.
- Wetherill has completed survey and working on bridge design options.
- Other four are Harlan, Cox, Gabriel, and Hasketts Creeks.



Conceptual Plan for County Section



- The County owns three miles along Deep River from Central Falls to Cedar Falls as part of the Landfill property.
- Since it is undeveloped land, a conceptual plan is needed to provide the alignment of the trail.
- Piedmont Triad Regional Council that did the DRST Conceptual Plan has completed a draft trail alignment including stream crossings/bridges.

Funding - \$100,000 RTP and \$25,000 Randleman and Asheboro


Worthville Access

Randleman Deep River Greenway Phase III



Worthville to Randleman

- Received \$100,000
 Recreational Trail
 Program grant with
 \$25,000 match from
 Randleman
- Will use Worthville river access for trailhead
- Plan to begin construction late 2022.

Ramseur Deep River Trail Extension and Trailhead





- Project is to purchase of Ramseur Dam and both sides of Deep River for extension of Ramseur Rail Trail to downtown, a trailhead at Old Depot, and portage at dam at Leonard Park
- Received \$128,000 Parks and Recreation Trust Fund (PARTF) grant matched with \$87,000 NC Land & Water Fund grant and \$50,000 from General Assembly for total of \$261,000
- Unique Places 2 Save is administering the grants and has begun the acquisition. Trail improvements projected to begin Summer 2023.







NC Textile Museum

- \$500,000 for 2 years
- Trailhead for the Cedar Falls to Franklinville section of DRST
- River access at Loflin Pond Rd Bridge.

NC DOT Great Trail State Plan





- NC DOT's GTS Plan
 connects all 100 counties
 and county seats via trails
- Working on designating five natural surface trail pilot projects
- Nominated two on DRST
 - Randleman to Randleman Lake and Randleman HS
 - Rocky River to Moncure in Chatham/Lee Counties

Archdale Creekside Park







- Received \$450,000 to complete extension of Creekside Park Greenway to AT Middle School
- Construction on 2000' loop at Creekside to be completed by Spring 2023
- 1st anniversary of Creekside parkrun, an international 5K event run by volunteers every Saturday at 9 am

Seagrove Downtown Sidewalks



- Implementation Fund Grant for the remaining \$108,000 needed to construct 1 mile of sidewalks in the Downtown
- Highest priority in the Seagrove Pedestrian Plan
- Connects potteries, other businesses, the library and Seagrove Elementary School
- Use public parking at newly relocated Depot

Liberty Freedom Park Improvements - LWCF



Freedom Park

- Liberty received a Land Water
 Conservation Fund grant for improvements at Freedom Park
- Includes splash pad, amphitheater and pickle ball courts

Asheboro Zoo City Sportsplex



- Phase I which is underway includes part of the 2 mile trail system planned.
- One trail paved and ADA compliant
- Another trail is natural surface.
- Projected to open Spring 2023

 Birkhead Wilderness


