

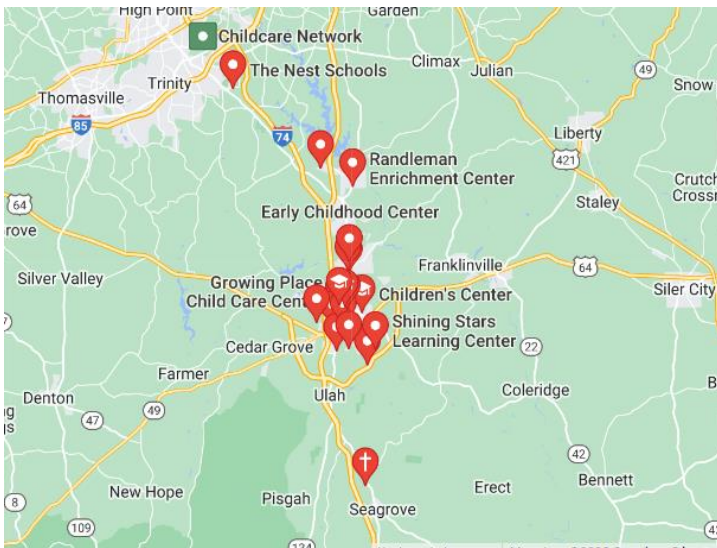
Teachers, Nurses, and Child-Care Workers Have Had Enough

The burnout crisis in pink-collar occupations puts everyone's well-being at risk.

Keypoints:

- The US has nearly 100,000 fewer child-care workers, a loss of 12%
- During the pandemic, 40% of childcare centers shut down – one in ten closed permanently
- A typical nanny or childcare worker makes \$13.22 an hour, according to Bureau of Labor Statistics
- The impossibility of finding reasonably priced childcare has contributed to some 330,000 mothers dropping out of the workforce.
