- 1.) Applicant is enrolled in an aviation related program with an accredited college, university, trade school, approved training center (Part 61, Part 141), or in current training with a certified flight instructor or A & P Mechanic. High school seniors with intentions of attending an accredited aviation related program (must provide proof: acceptance letters, letters of reference from school counselors, etc.) are also eligible.
- 2.) Applicant intends to use their training to work in Alaska.
- 3.) Applicant has maintained a minimum GPA of 3.0; or if not enrolled in an accredited college, university, or trade school, will provide a letter of recommendation from current instructor attesting to commitment of student to applicable training endeavor.
- 4.) Applicant has no felony convictions.
- 5.) Applicant is a legal US resident and has been a legal Alaskan resident for at least 2 of the last 3 years.
- 6.) Knowledge about the Airmen Association, student or other Airmen membership is preferred.

Selection Criteria

Scholarships will be awarded weighted on each of the following:

- 1.) Commitment to aviation goals
- 2.) Interest in general and commercial aviation in Alaska
- 3.) Evidence of financial need
- 4.) Personal and career goals
- 5.) Other criteria as determined by the scholarship committee

ALL SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AWARDED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE, BASED ON THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS AND CRITERIA

Disbursement of funds is made directly to the educational institution or training facility specifically for payment of tuition, flight training, specified labs, books or training manuals only. All funds must be used

within 2 years of the award. All applications must be postmarked on or before February 1st, 2020. Late applications will be returned to sender unopened.

Important Note Regarding Scholarship Numbers and Amounts

As part of a recent decision to increase the Association's scholarship funding from \$17,000 to over \$40,000 for the 2020 fiscal year, the exact number of scholarships and their subsequent amounts have yet to be determined. As such, the Alaska Airmen have decided to refrain from finalizing said amounts on new scholarships until the size of the qualified applicant pool has been properly examined. The Airmen can, at the very least, guarantee applicants that the number of awards and amount of money distributed will increase from previous years.
