McKee Builders to assist with the completion of Catherine **Twomey House**

Funds, labor and furniture donated to support Chester County initiative

COATESVILLE, PA. » A local builder is partnering with a non-profit organization to combat the growing issue of middle-aged women on the brink of homelessness in Chester County. McKee Builders is donating their time to aid in the restoration of The Catherine Twomey House, a Home of the Sparrow Project. The renovated house will have the capacity to host up to six women at any given time while also providing them with direct access to transportation, healthcare resources and grocery stores.

The home building community, most especially the Home **Builders Association of Ches**ter and Delaware Counties, has graciously taken it upon themselves to assist with the renovation of the house. The majority of the funds and supplies have been donated, in-kind, by generous beneficiaries throughout the area. McKee has committed to help with the coordination of the project while also supplying both labor and furniture. TC Electric has also been influential in the project, teaming up with McKee to provide additional labor and materials. The contributions significantly decrease the financial responsibility of the organization, allowing funds to be used on additional projects. The support also enables the organization to stay on track with the completion schedule of late Summer 2016.

Since 1994, Home of the Sparrow has helped thousands of the most vulnerable women and children in the community find stable homes and transform their lives. They are the only organization in the state of Pennsylvania that provides Shared Housing – a distinctive solution to the affordable housing crisis for older women. The Catherine Twomey House will simply be more than a temporary home. Through the support that will be provided during their stay, women will walk away with newfound abilities to live independently and selfsufficiently.

Many are unaware of the hardships that women between the ages of 55 and 62 face, due to their ineligibility for critical government benefits until they reach 62. For the first time since 1959, the federal government has eliminated funding for new construction for senior housing. "We are happy to support foundations within our community who are dedicated to such a worthy cause," said Frank McKee. "As a company, we have a strong desire to use our skillset to lift members of the community who have fallen on hard times. This unique opportunity to aid with the restoration of The Catherine Twomey House sits close to our hearts, especially since the majority of our work is geared towards 55+ adults. We are proud to be a part of such a meaningful initiative."
