Mutual or automatic aid?



Mutual aid

Assistance that is dispatched upon request

Automatic aid

Assistance that is dispatched automatically on a first alarm assignment





Reimbursement and Mutual Aid



- "Solito negotium" or "business as usual"
 - Must be in a written agreement
 - If you don't charge for mutual aid, you won't be reimbursed by the State of FEMA for mutual aid
- Typical agreement language should provide for:
 - Reimbursement of costs
 - A "no cost" period, usually 12 consecutive hours
 - A "reimbursement from available funds" clause
- No agreement? Tx Gov't Code 418, Subchapter E-1





Advantages of Automatic aid



- Response by closest unit
- Avoid apparatus duplication
- Reach effective response force levels
- Share specialty services.
- Increase availability of staff officers for ICS
- Improve ISO class rating





Automatic aid and ISO



- ISO will recognize an automatic-aid plan:
 - Must fill a need
 - May include firefighters only, or firefighters + apparatus
 - Must be prearranged according to plan and dispatched on the initial alarm
 - Must be provided 24 hours a day, 365 days a year
 - Preferable to have a written agreement
 - Should have common radio channels and SOP/SOGs

- Introduction and recitals
- Contract period, renewal, and termination
- Definitions
- Representations and responsibilities
- Services to be provided
- Financial responsibilities and capital assets
- Insurance, indemnification, and insurance proceeds
- Reports
- Miscellaneous
- Exhibits
