# **Pro-Rated Dues**

- We understand as a board we work for the membership, and we have a voice for the membership if they come to us.
- I had a District President approach me at Lubbock, and we even talked after Lubbock. With the possibility, with this new data system being built, is there a possibility that it could be built into that system for prorated dues.
- The District President stated they get one check a year. Once he is paid, if new members come on in August, He stated if a pay the full 50.00 I don't get any benefit in the first few months.
- The way he looked at it is he said the year is divided into 4 quarters if you put 12.50 per quarters it will equal fifty dollars.
- He said that other departments if a members joins say in August they may not sign him up, because they don't what to pay that whole \$50.00, when they know that the renewals are coming up.
- By prorate if they join anytime within that quarter, you pay that \$12.50.
- As it is they are waiting and then they are training or on a response and something happens to them, they are not cover by anything or the association.
- I told him I would bring it up to the board, I don't think it would take an amendment to the dues, maybe the board could make a policy, I want to go back and let him that we did talk about it, if we decide to make a decision.
- Would there be a by-law change?
- Programming wise it can be done, there is some hesitancy about it.
- We also need to look at budgeting, and how extensive it becomes. Along with the training aspect in this.

#### **Retired Membership**

- Was contacted by a retired member, and several other retired members are interested in trying to stay involved.
- Membership in subject and Shall be available to any retired person who has been an active member of the SFFMA of Texas.
- Can we created another membership, Individual Retired Membership, along years of service.
- The retired individual spoke nothing about voting.
- Would have a Retirement membership card, that would entitle to be a voting delegate to vote on matters of the association, the annual training conference.

- Their membership can be terminated.
- This could be another revenue source.
- There would some limitations and clarifications.
- This will require a by-law change.
