City of Phoenix District 5 Coronavirus Update (03/18/2020)

- Yesterday, (March 17) the Mayor declared a State of Emergency in the City of Phoenix
- ALL 15 Senior Centers are closed
 - Details for ongoing lunch service have been provided to all Senior Center members
- City parks, including dog parks, skate parks and sports complexes, and hiking trails are open for general recreational use
- City golf courses and their restaurants are open
- ALL Parks and Recreation Centers are closed EXCEPT for Desert Botanical Garden and Phoenix Tennis Center (in Washington Park) are open
- In an Administrative Order issued today (March 18th), the Court has implemented temporary measures to reduce in-person contact:
 - Continues all criminal jury trials scheduled from March 18 through March 31 and excuses those summoned for jury duty
 - Cancels all criminal bench trials (non-jury trials) for defendants that are not in custody scheduled from March 18 through May 12, 2020 and resets the matters to status conferences to occur after May 12, 2020
 - Continues all civil hearings for eight weeks
 - Continues all non-trial settings for defendants that are not in custody for eight weeks
 - Directs that all Order of Protection and Injunction Against Harassment proceedings continue to be held and that telephonic appearances take place where feasible
 - Cancels all non-essential Court functions until further notice

Ciudad de Phoenix distrito 5 coronavirus actualización (03/18/2020)

- *Ayer (17 de marzo) la alcaldesa declaró el estado de emergencia en la ciudad de Phoenix.*
- *TODOS los 15 centros para personas mayores están cerrados*
 - *Se han proporcionado detalles sobre el servicio de almuerzo continuo a todos los miembros del Centro para personas mayores.*
- *Los parques de la ciudad, incluidos los parques para perros, los parques de patinaje y los complejos deportivos, y las rutas de senderismo están abiertas para uso recreativo general.*
- *Los campos de golf de la ciudad y sus restaurantes están abiertos.*
- *TODOS los parques y centros de recreación están cerrados, EXCEPTO el Jardín Botánico del Desierto y el Centro de Tenis Phoenix (en el Parque Washington) están abiertos.*
- *En una orden administrativa emitida hoy (18 de marzo), el Tribunal ha implementado medidas temporales para reducir el contacto en persona*
 - *Continúa todos los juicios por jurado penal programados desde el 18 de marzo hasta el 31 de marzo y excusa a los convocados para el servicio de jurado*
 - *Cancela todos los juicios penales (juicios sin jurado) para los acusados que no están bajo custodia programados del 18 de marzo al 12 de mayo de 2020 y restablece los asuntos a las conferencias de estado que tendrán lugar después del 12 de mayo de 2020*

- Continúa todas las audiencias civiles durante ocho semanas.
- Continúa todos los entornos no procesales para los acusados que no están bajo custodia durante ocho semanas.
- Dirige que todos los procedimientos de Orden de Protección y Orden Judicial contra el Acoso continúen en curso y que las apariciones telefónicas se realicen siempre que sea posible
- Cancela todas las funciones judiciales no esenciales hasta nuevo aviso.
