


The West Valley is by far the best place for your business investment!

Attendees at nonprofit arts events spend \$24.60 per person per event, beyond the price of admission on items such as meals, parking, gas, babysitting, clothing - valuable revenue for local commerce. Arts also contributes to Tourism in a community which helps support hotels, restaurants, and many other businesses. The U. S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reports that the Arizona Arts and Culture sector contributes \$9.3 Billion to Arizona’s economy, representing 3% of the state’s GDP - a larger share than some other industries in the state.”


