- Thinking about your district, if elected/re-elected, what will be your legislative priorities?

Education & Workforce

- ➤ Thinking about K-12 education, and addressing the attraction and retention of Public-School teachers, what are some things that can be done through the General Assembly to help localities improve teacher retention and attraction?
- What are some things that can be done to improve literacy and math proficiency in your district?
- ➤ How should the Commonwealth of Virginia invest taxpayer dollars to improve our K-12 educational system, with the goal of creating a well-trained, skilled workforce? What are some creative ideas to improve the K-12 system?
- What are some additional ways the Commonwealth of Virginia can improve or enhance STEM programming?
- Thinking about post-High School educational and training opportunities, what are some ways to address the affordability of college/workforce readiness programs and ensure all young adults regardless of income, physical ability, and race - have access to education and job training opportunities?
- How can we provide additional support to school counselors and teachers to present all possible pathways (college track AND skilled trades)?
