Water Main & Water Tower Project Updates by Bill Kennedy, Mayor

The water main project started on July 22nd, with the water tower portion to start soon after that. The expected work completion date is October 15, 2021. The work will start on First Street, Murray Ave, and Whipple Ave

and extend into all the other streets affected. There will be intermittent road closures. All businesses will be accessible via sidewalk until it is time to reconstruct those sidewalks, then alternate entrances will be used as available. At all times, there should be a route to get to wherever you need to get to, but you might have to 'go around' to get there.

Everyone who lives or works in an area being impacted by this work wants to know when and how this is going to affect them. Please be patient, aware, safe, and understanding that this is an active construction project that will move and work as best it can to get the job done. There will be some inconveniences, and the public just needs to be aware of that and react accordingly.

Please do not enter the construction zones or try to ask questions of the work crews. If you have specific questions, they should be directed to Amber Muir from Moore Engineering who is the construction liaison. Check for updates on the City website: cityofhackensackmn.org.

Most days there are at least 100 kids or more, plus their families flocking to the pier, and it is transformed from a quiet serene place to pure organized pandemonium.




Before the pandemic, Hackensack Pickleball Club had over 60 members that played in the Hackensack Community Center. When Covid hit, playing indoors was suspended. The club received permission from the City to paint pickleball court lines on the tennis courts and use the tennis court nets.

This year, we have both options open to us. If you prefer to play inside, you will need to sign up using Playtimescheduler.com, show your Covid vaccine card (one time), and fill out a waiver form. If you prefer to play outside, the tennis courts are there for you.

Member is \$10 and \$2 per playing time. Non-members pay \$3 per playing time.

City of Hackensack Comprehensive Plan Summer Update

As we move toward the wrap-up of the City's comprehensive planning process, It's important to recognize the level of time, effort, thought, and consideration that the local planning team (LPT) has put forth throughout this process, with particular emphasis on gathering public input.

From our public informational kickoff meeting in late July of last year to the community survey conducted in November 2020, the 30-day public review/comment period that ended last month, along with many other opportunities for public input, the local planning team has striven to crystalize the community's vision for Hackensack. In turn, they translated that vision into streamlined, actionable goals and policies to guide Hackensack's development into the near future through its DRAFT Comprehensive Plan.

Throughout the process, the consultants and the LPT have maintained a webpage dedicated to the comprehensive planning process where anyone can access the meeting materials including agendas, meeting minutes, and handouts at regionfive.org/Hackensack.

The other half of the equation deserves just as hearty a thank you and that is YOU - residents, business owners, and visitors who spoke up, shared views, provided feedback, and reviewed the DRAFT goals and DRAFT plan. Your input and feedback was the most valuable asset to the LPT. Your voices shaped the DRAFT plan which can be also be viewed at the Region Five-Hackensack link above.

The planning team and consultants presented the DRAFT plan to the City Council at the July 19th meeting. The plan will come before the City Council in August for council action. As always members of the public are welcome to attend council meetings.

tin, tungsten-nickel alloy, steel, bismuth, or glass. Ask at your local tackle store or shop online.

Want to try lead-free tackle? Give us at least 4 ounces of your lead tackle (split shots, sinkers, jigs) and we'll give you **some lead-free tackle samples and a coupon for one free beverage** (one pint or less – alcoholic or non-alcoholic) from Rendezvous Brewing in Hackensack.

Bring your lead tackle to Rendezvous Brewing, First Street, downtown Hackensack on **Tuesday**, **August 10**, **from 1-3 p.m.**
