

Welcome back to Hackensack where spring has finally sprung. Have you had a chance to check out our new lights downtown? We think they really brighten up the town and provide a cozy but modern feel.

The question we get the most right now is: "When are we going to finish the construction project from last year?" We are just waiting for the road restrictions to lift and the crew to be able to come to town. We have a list of items to repair, replace, or finish. We also plan to replicate some of the work done on this project onto the Highway 371 project in 2024 with lighting and trees along the boulevard.

We have installed a new Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Station in the parking lot across from the Municipal Bar. We look forward to the increase in electric car traffic into town. New solar-powered crosswalks will be installed across Hwy 371 on Lake Ave. and at Mann Lake Bee & Ag Supply across County 40 this spring. We have great teams working on the housing and

daycare shortage in our area. This is not an easy one to solve; it takes investors, time, and money.

I'd like to welcome and introduce Bruce Reeve (pictured) as our newly appointed Council Person. He is a great addition to our council bringing his great love of Hackensack and years of experience in the printing industry as a maintenance engineer. We have some great events coming up this spring, summer, and fall. We will have a dedication ceremony to the new construction project with a ribbon cutting, Sweetheart Days, Children's Fishing Contests, Lakeside Concert Series in the Park, Northwoods Art & Book Festival, Pork in the Park, and the Chainsaw Event. Hackensack has so much to offer, we hope you come to town and participate in all the fun.



On June 25th 2022, the Spring Bike Fling comes to Hackensack! Expect at least 100 cyclists to roll in to Hackensack starting at around 11:00am. The Hackensack Chamber is supporting this event, the primary sponsor being the Leech Lake Area Chamber. Rendezvous Brewing will be a host site for the group while in Hackensack, and the Northwoods Arts Council is providing live music (Wayne & the Boys) underwritten by the Hackensack Lakes Area Community Foundation. Members of the community foundation, arts council and the Hackensack Lions will provide hosting services to our guests! Beverages will be available at Rendezvous and our Community Foundation will have tasty food for sale.

Bike Friendly Walker named this year's event "To Hack and Back." This is the third annual event. The first took place in 2019, was interrupted in 2020 by COVID, and hosted almost

one hundred participants in 2021. The event concludes in Walker at Portage Brewing.

There will be three possible biking distances to choose from: 24 miles (straight down the Shingobee connection); 48 miles (follow the Walker Loop there and back); and 36 miles (a combination of both). A free Family Bike Ride (2 miles) is also included starting at 10:30am. All registered cyclists will start at 10:00 am from the Walker City Park. Entrants will receive a swag bag courtesy of Cass County LiveHealthy. The bag will be full of information, maps, emergency numbers, a commemorative medallion, gifts and coupons from local businesses. Some selected bags will contain special prizes (such as a full meal at a local restaurant OR a full day rental from Rambo Electric Bikes). A ribbon-cutting ceremony of First Street in Hackensack will also take place. This will be great exercise and a really fun filled day. In April of 2020, the city of Hackensack officially became a GreenStep city, joining what is now a network of 143 cities and four tribal nations that together encompass over 52% of all Minnesotans.

GreenStep Cities and Tribal Nations is a program that supports communities in reaching their sustainability and quality-of-life goals. It defines Best Practices for sustainability, and communities can choose actions to take from menus under each Best Practice. GreenStep measures a community's sustainability journey using "steps." Step 1 is achieved simply by having its city or tribal council pass a resolution to join GreenStep. Steps 2 and 3 are achieved by reporting different actions, and Steps 4 and 5 emphasize reporting metrics. GreenStep is completely voluntary, and communities can advance through the program at their own pace with support from GreenStep and its partners.

So what sort of things has Hackensack done as a GreenStep city?

You might be familiar with Hackensack's community garden in the Bonna Paulson park. The garden provides 20 plots, water, and storage, uses no-till practices, and doesn't allow for pesticides or herbicides. (See article on page 7.) That's a GreenStep action! So is the 2021 First Street Reconstruction, which included new sidewalks, improved pedestrian safety, bump-outs, 25 diverse trees, decorative LED street lighting, an EV charger, and stormwater management. With a total of 23 actions from 13 best practices, Hackensack will be formally recognized as a Step 2 city in June 2022. Congratulations!

Classy Street Lamps Light Up - Approximately 4 years ago, Hackensack Game Changers learned that a redo was forthcoming of some local streets including the widening of sidewalks along the businesses on 1st Street South. Since the Hackensack Game Changers mission is "to work on projects for the benefit and wellbeing of the community," this seemed to be a perfect time to incorporate decorative lampposts as part of the plan. We are so excited to announce that Hackensack now has 20 new, beautiful decorative LED lampposts in place. 

Welcoming submissions from poets of Cass, Crow Wing, Morrison, Milles Lacs, Todd, Wadena, Hubbard, Beltrami, Itasca and Aitkin Counties. Up to three poems may be submitted and may include previously published poems. Eleven poems will be selected for display on decorated Poetry Safari stands throughout the Northwoods Art & Book Festival. Community Garden

Started two years ago as part of the SHIP program, the **Hackensack Community Garden** gives people who don't have access to gardening basics a chance to rent a plot of land and garden in the company of others. Hackensack emphasizes natural gardening practices, meaning that no insecticides, herbicides or fungicides are allowed. With minimal soil disturbance, the ground isn't tilled and no chemicals are used. Instead, mulch, cover crops, and pioneer plants utilization are part of what makes this type of gardening work. Only natural fertilizers - wood ash from Deep Portage Learning Center's wood gasification heating system and pelletized sulfur and compost from a local farmer - are used.

The garden is located at the east end of Lake Avenue in Hackensack, in the Bonna Paulson Wildlife Observatory. The fenced area is 120 x 40 feet. It has eight 10 x 20 foot beds, three 10 x 10 beds, and nine raised beds for people who might like to work in soil closer to waist height. Jim Etzel, owner of Earth is Our Home Environmental Solutions, is the consultant for this garden. Jim will be teaching about no-till natural gardening and its focus on providing the utmost care for the soil system.
