WEATHER

Every season offers something unique in Barton County. Autumn begins in late September and reveals a dramatic display of foliage, with warm Indian summer days turning into crisp fall days by October's end.

Winter arrives in November and does not usually bring the long bouts of cold or heavy snow that frequent more northern states. Spring usually starts in March with cool, rainy days and brisk evenings. Summer weather usually begins in mid-May and is enjoyable through early September.

TRANSPORTATION

Truman Area Transportation Service (TATS) Anyone needing a ride may call the T.A.T.S. line at (417) 682-5542, Monday-Friday between the hours of 6:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Rides are available for the elderly and disabled with no means of transportation. Rides are provided county-wide (Medical Only) with a 24hour notice. \$3 per ride/ \$1 per ride for Seniors or disabled individuals. Limit 4 One-Way Trips per Day.

OATS Transit is also available in Barton County. To schedule a ride, contact the SW OATS Transit Office at *800-770-6287*, or visit *www.oatstransit.org/barton* for schedule and fares.

AIRPORT

Lamar Municipal Airport covers 105 acres (42 hectare) and has two runways, 17/35 is a concrete runway 4,000 by 75 feet (1,220 x 23m), and 3/21 is 2,900 by 60 feet (885 x 18m) asphalt runway.

For the year ending 2016, the airport had 5,320 aircraft operations, an average of 15 per day: 94% general aviation, 6% air taxi, and less than 1% military. In December 2019, there were 17 aircraft based at this airport: 14 single-engine and 3 ultralights





Barton County WERE WE'VE BEEN


Barton County was once a large expanse of prairie. The grass grew taller than a man on horseback. The Osage Indians traveled along the creeks and streams. A few nomadic hunters, trappers, and traders camped periodically. The first permanent settlers were here in 1820. They eventually obtained their land by squatters' rights allowed by the U.S. Land Office.

In 1852 George Ward, his son-in-law, Joseph Parry, and their families traveled through the area, liked what they saw, and decided to make this their home. Three years later, George Ward worked to get a part of Jasper County divided to create Barton County. It is named in honor

of Missouri's first U.S. Senator, David Barton. George Ward then donated 50 acres needed to establish the county seat of Lamar in 1857. Lamar was named after Maribeau Buonaparte Lamar, a friend of George Ward and the second President of the Republic of Texas.

The county began with seven townships, eventually dividing into the current 15. In 1860 the population climbed to 1,817, but the Border War with Kansas and the Civil War left the county with only a few brave families remaining by 1864. Sympathies between the Union and Confederates were equally divided. After the war, residents quickly returned from where they had sought refuge and began the process of rebuilding.


Land advocate investors, namely C.Y. Trice and David Beamer, advertised heavily in Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio. Farmers were drawn to the area



by the reasonable prices for prime prairie land. By 1870 the county had well exceeded its pre-war count to 5,087 people.

Stagecoach lines connected Lamar to neighboring towns. Two railroad lines came to crisscross the county and intersect in Lamar. The Kansas City, Ft. Scott & Memphis Railroad (later referred to as the Gulf of Frisco) came through in 1880 and the Missouri





Pacific in 1881. Allowing farmers to ship their grain, cattle, and produce to major markets. The county built ten iron-framed bridges and six wood bridges between 1881-1886 to improve the transportation infrastructure. Many small villages emerged along the railroad tracks, including churches and schools. Rural schools remained until consolidation occurred into four school districts in 1964.








The western half of the county still holds much prairie land. During WWI the largest supply of prairie hay came from Barton County. Prairie State Park now owns over 4,000 acres. It is Missouri's largest remaining tallgrass prairie. Over 50 bison and 25 elk graze the park. Coal mining in the far western side of the county in 1905 employed 522 miners in 29 mines. Both the deep and strip mines were operational until the 1970s. Barton County has matured over the decades but always remained an agricultural area, making this a great place to live.

Attractions WHERE HISTORY AND NATURE COME TOGETHER


Home to famous individuals such as President Harry S Truman, Wyatt Earp, and Three World War II Admirals, as well as more than a dozen conservation parks, prairies, forests, and walking trails. Barton County will enchant visitors and residents alike. Taking them back to a simpler time in American History. Here are just a few points of interest that you definitely do not want to miss!

WYATT EARP PARK

A new addition to Lamar will be completed in the spring of 2022, honoring our most famous constable and his Legendary Beginnings, Wyatt Earp. The park was made possible by the generosity of The Lamar Bank & Trust Community Fund. The park will contain a statue of Wyatt and his wife Urilla (Sutherland) Earp. With historic murals depicting their story in our community.

The Wyatt Earp Park is located on the Northeast corner of the Lamar Downtown square. Directly across the street from where Wyatt & Urilla were married in the Exchange Hotel and the current location of Lamar Bank & Trust bank building.

The Wyatt Earp Park will feature a music pavilion perfect for concerts, outdoor learning, open-air gatherings, and community events throughout the year.



Wyatt Earp was born March 19, 1848 in Monmouth, IL. Very little is known of his early years, but the family moved to Lamar, Missouri in 1869 when Wyatt was around 21 years old. During his early time here, he was appointed Lamar's town Constable on November 26, 1869, following his father's (Nicholas Earp's) resignation.

Wyatt met & then married Urilla Southerland on January 10, 1870. With the death of his wife and unborn child, Wyatt headed west to begin his journey and become one of America's frontier legends.



BARTON COUNTY MEMORIAL PARK

The second new addition to Lamar is the Barton County Memorial Park, on the site of the old Barton County Memorial Hospital which opened in 1949. It was built as a memorial to the 69 Barton County soldiers that died in WWII. It was the first memorial in Missouri to be dedicated to its fallen soldiers. This was, and still is, our guiding force in creating the BCMP. The southwest corner, dedicated to the 69 fallen soldiers will feature 69 service markers engraved with the name of each soldier, their rank, branch of service and the day they died. A replica plaque of the one that was in the lobby of the original hospital will be displayed, as well as two benches.

Several areas of the Memorial Park are currently under construction. This includes the area for the 69 men, a 44' War Memorial featuring seven black granite triangles detailing the major wars the USA has fought in and a 20' wide Walk of Honor that will feature pavers inscribed with the names of veterans who has served our country. This could be peace time, war time, Civil War or the War on Terror. These 12" x 12" pavers are currently being sold and will be engraved soon. Additional areas are being planned, including a gazebo, a First Responder area and an area dedicated to BCMH employees, as well as anyone who had anything to do with the hospital, such as being born there.

The BCMP is 100% funded by donations, grants, fundraisers and volunteers. No tax money, federal, state or local is being used. If you would like to purchase a paver, donate to the Memorial Park or read more about it, please visit our website at *www.bcmpark.com*.

TRUMAN BIRTHPLACE

Visit the birthplace home of the only Missourian ever elected President of the United States - Harry S Truman. Born May 8, 1884, in a downstairs southwest bedroom of a small 20' by 28' frame house in Lamar, Harry S Truman was the son of John & Martha (Young) Truman.

Visitors today can view its four downstairs rooms and two upstairs rooms, as well as the smokehouse, well, and an outhouse located in the back. The modest furnishings inside the house and the surrounding landscape accurately represent a typical home during the time Truman resided in Lamar. It has neither electricity nor indoor plumbing.. ~*Missouri State Parks*



THE BARTON COUNTY COURTHOUSE AND COURTYARD

No visit to Barton County would be complete without experiencing Lamar's Downtown Square and Shopping district. Lamar's Constitution Square is crowned, with the majestic Barton County Courthouse, which dates back to 1889.

The Barton County Historical Society maintains a museum in the basement of the historic Barton County Courthouse. Information is available from our archives by calling our volunteer staff and requesting a search. The information is free, but we ask that you offer a donation to help us provide information to historians, genealogists, and those interested in the history of Barton County. *(Hours are 1pm to 4pm - (417) 682-4141*)



Other historical highlights of the Square include a Civil War Cannon dedicated in 1910, a bandstand built-in

1913 on the northeast corner of the courtyard. In 1950 a 17-foot-tall replica of the Statue of Liberty statue was erected. As a gift to the community from the school children of the county.

A Navy Anchor adorns the courtyard to commemorate our 3 Navy Admirals from Barton County. To commemorate Harry Truman's Vice-Presidential acceptance speech from 1944, a Truman Memorial was placed at the base of the courthouse steps.

LAMAR'S THREE ADMIRALS

Though far from any ocean, this anchor (photo lower right) is placed as a symbolic monument. It is dedicated to the steadfast commitment of four very notable individuals from this community. In a time of war, our nation called upon men and women of every walk of life to join together in arms to protect her and her people.

Two of these men, Admirals Daubin and Lockwood, would become commanders of all three submarine fleets of the entire U.S. Navy. The other, Admiral Combs would become commander of the mighty aircraft carrier Yorktown and the 2nd and 6th Naval fleets. Yet one more man born here in Lamar would become their Commander-in-Chief, President Harry S Truman. These four men all had a significant impact on the outcome of WWII and the people who served this great nation.

This Danforth-style anchor used on landing craft is 94"long and weighs 3000 lbs. The anchor is on loan from The Naval History and Heritage Command.






THE JEFFERSON HIGHWAY

The Jefferson Highway was started around 1915 as part of the National Auto Trail system. It was nicknamed the "Pines to Palms" highway because it stretched from the pine trees of Canada to the palm trees of New Orleans. Named for President Thomas Jefferson the highway was inspired by the east-west Lincoln Highway, one of the earliest transcontinental highways for automobiles access the United States. A 1917 article told of four Canadian officials driving the entire 2,267 miles from Winnipeg to New Orleans. They crossed seven states, seventy counties, and 264 cities, towns, and villages.

The earliest record of the Jefferson Highway in Lamar was mentioned in an article dated November 11, 1915. The article titled "Lamar Is Putting Her Shoulder to the Road" talks about the highway and the benefits of it coming through Barton County. The Jefferson Highway was an ever-evolving entity.



Early records indicate the Jefferson Highway came through Lamar from the north in three different ways throughout the years. The route along the Jefferson Highway was marked, first with just a simple JH logo painted on telephone poles. Later stenciled signs were used and then eventually porcelain signs. The historical society has uncovered photos that show the

JH markings on the telephone poles. One was on the Southeast corner of 9th and Gulf. This would have been right in front of the Commercial Hotel. *(Picture to the left).*



In the late 1920s, the Jefferson Highway was replaced with the new

numbered US Highway system. The Jefferson Highway was bypassed by one of the new interstates that crisscrossed the country. The historic Jefferson Highway, which is over a decade older than Route 66, is trying to make a comeback. It is still known as the Jefferson in parts of Minnesota, Kansas City, and especially in the New Orleans area. ~ Joe Davis Barton County Historical Society





PRAIRIE STATE PARK

Experience a walking tour through prairie grasses that tower above your head with a chance to view wildlife native to the prairie landscape.

More than 13 million acres of tallgrass prairie once covered more than one-third of Missouri's landscape. Today, less than 65,000 acres remain. Prairie State Park is Missouri's largest remaining tallgrass prairie landscape., at nearly 4,000 acres.

More than 25 rare and endangered plant and animal species have been recorded in Prairie State Park, some of which are not found anywhere else in the state. A reintroduced bison herd freely grazes across the landscape, shaping the earth with grazed patches, trails and wallows.

The spectacular panoramic vista of Prairie State Park is a sea of grass strewn with the colors of ever-changing wildflowers. In spring, bouquets of yellow star grass and Indian paintbrush set the stage for a variety of breeding grassland birds. Growing taller each day, summer wildflowers include pale purple coneflower, Mead's milkweed, and prairie blazing star. By fall, grasses such as big blue steam and Indian grass may reach 8 feet high.


During any season, visitors can experience prairie life by hiking one of the park's trails. Visitors can take a short hike or reserve the park's backpacking camp and sleep under the vast prairie sky. The trails also provide a great place for nature study, photography, and viewing wildflowers and wildlife. The park also has a picnic area and limited camping. Potable water is available on the south side of the shop building before you enter the camping and picnicking area.




The park's Regal Tallgrass Prairie Nature Center

features exhibits that interpret the tallgrass prairie, such as a diorama depicting the prairie from spring to fall, a bison exhibit, and interactive activities. Park naturalists conduct programs that interpret prairie life and stress the importance of preserving this rare and sweeping historic landscape. ~ Missouri State Parks

Recreation WORK HARD PLAY HARDER

PLAZA THEATER AND BARCO DRIVE-IN

Digital picture, Dolby sound, and first-run movies each week are just a few reasons to come out and enjoy a show at the Historic Plaza Theater on the Lamar Square or the Barco Drive-In just on the eastern edge of Lamar.

The Barco Drive-In has been operating since 1950 and is one of the last Drive-In theaters in the United States. Barco offers double features all summer long and is sure to be a treat for anyone of any age. The Plaza Theater is a restored classic one-screen movie theater, complete with a cry room for the little ones so mom and dad can still enjoy the film without worry! Prices at both theaters are very competitive in the area making a night out at the movies affordable for any budget.







LAMAR CITY LAKE

One of the most beautiful spots in Lamar is the City Lake. With 250-acres of water surface and thousands of feet of shoreline and is perfect for recreational fishing. The lake also has picnic tables, a covered boat slip, and four flotation fishing docks. The lake is stocked regularly with black crappie, channel cat, bluegill, and large-mouth bass.

Passes can be purchased for fishing at \$2 a day or (\$30 annually), for boating is \$3 a day or (\$45



annually). North of town on Muddy Creek is a joint project of the Missouri Department of Natural Resources and the City of Lamar: the Old North Dam area features a boat ramp to enhance the picnic and fishing experience. The North Dam is a perfect, scenic, peaceful escape to nature.



LAMAR CITY PARK

Some of Southwest Missouri's most beautiful landscaping is found at the 55-acre Lamar City Park. This attraction includes extensive playground equipment in three different play areas, fishpond, covered bridge, one enclosed shelter house, six open air-shelter houses, a one-mile hiking trail, a dog park, a high school baseball diamond, two Little League regulation baseball diamonds, three softball fields, two t-ball fields, four concession stands, two basketball courts, a tennis court, a sand volleyball

court, and a disc golf course. There is no tent camping allowed in the city park, but there is space for RV parking. RV guests may park at no charge for one night, with a \$20 per night fee for additional nights. Water, electricity & dumping stations are available for those camping in Lamar City Park.

LAMAR AQUATIC PARK

The Lamar Aquatic Park sits just inside the northwest entrance of the Lamar City Park. The Competition or lap pool features 3,200 square feet, six 25-meter lap lanes. The Natatorium, or indoor facility, features 3,500square feet with two 25-meter lap lanes, water aerobics, and water therapy classes. Other features are a bathhouse, concession area, showers, and lockers. The indoor facility is open year-round, closed only for the week of the Lamar Free Fair and the week between Christmas and New Year. The Lamar Aquatic Park hosts both the Lamar High School boys and girls swim teams and the Lamar Tigersharks summer swim team.

THIEBAUD AUDITORIUM

The luxurious Thiebaud Auditorium hosts several productions a year by the Lamar Community Theater & Lamar R-1 Schools and serves as a venue for cultural events for all of Barton County. This plush facility features state-of-the-art sound and lighting systems to enhance the performing arts experiences. The main auditorium seats 805 guests and features two large meeting rooms are available to accommodate up to 200 guests.



WHEELER PARK

One of the newest parks in Lamar is Wheeler Park, located in the Wheeler subdivision off East Sixth Street. This beautiful park features a two-acre fishing pond, a playground, and a shelter complete with restroom facilities. Wheeler Park is also the site of the Memorial Avenue of Trees. The avenue consists of trees donated to the park system in memory of a loved one or to commemorate an event. All the trees in this avenue are lovely Red Sunset Maples.







STILABOWER OBSERVATORY

The Stilabower Public Observatory is one of the few community-owned observatories in the nation. A unique aspect of this observatory is its design, which is handicapped-accessible.

This facility boasts a 14-inch telescope, computerized tracking, and a digital imaging system. Recently, an updated telescope allows visitors to input coordinates or objects, which allows the telescope to track them across the sky. The facility is open selected evenings by special appointment.



VOTING IN BARTON COUNTY

ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF VOTER ID

Show one of the forms of acceptable identification and sign the poll book to obtain your ballot: For more information visit www.sos.mo.gov/showit2vote

- Identification issued by the state of Missouri, an agency of the state, or a local election authority of the state.
- Identification issued by the United States government or agency thereof.
- Identification issued by an institution of higher education, including a university, college, vocational and technical school, located within the state of Missouri.
- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or other government documents that contain the name and address of the voter.

ABSENTEE VOTING

Registered Missourians who expect to be prevented from going to their polling place on Election Day may vote absentee beginning six weeks before an election. Voters can request absentee ballots from the County Clerk's Office in person, by mail, or by e-mail.

Relatives within the second degree (spouse, parents, and children) may complete an absentee ballot application, in person, on behalf of the voter who wishes to vote absentee.

- If you do not possess any of these forms of identification but are a registered voter, you may cast a provisional ballot.
- Your provisional ballot will count if: (1) you return to your polling place on Election Day with a photo ID; or (2) the signature on your provisional ballot envelope is determined by your local election authority to match the signature on your voter registration record.
- If you cast a provisional ballot, you will receive a stub from your provisional ballot envelope with instructions on how to verify that your provisional ballot is counted.

Mail-in or faxed absentee ballot requests must be received by County Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on the second Wednesday prior to any election. Voters can vote by absentee in the office of the local election authority until 5:00 p.m. the night before the election.
