Our 2023 Florida Legislative Session will take place in Tallahassee from March 7 to May 5. Here are FREA's stated legislative priorities for the upcoming year:

1. FREA will advocate for legislators to restore, enhance, and protect our retiree Earned Benefits from the Florida Retirement System.

2. FREA will promote accountability in Florida Public Schools, including funding and uniform standards for all educational facilities and organizations that receive state tax dollars.

3. FREA will advocate for senior health and welfare issues that will ensure retirement with dignity, empowering people to choose how they will live as they age; including, but not limited to, support for Social Security and Medicare Benefits, Health Insurance, Cost of Living Adjustment, and affordable and accessible housing.

FREA (the Florida Retired Educators Association) is a non-profit, non-partisan organization made up of educators, school personnel, and citizens who care about public education and the protection of retiree benefits that are earned through the Florida Retirement System (FRS).

Scholarship for Future Florida Teachers

Applications must be in by January 20, 2023

Florida Retired Educators Foundation

Since 1980, FREF has awarded scholarships for high school graduates who wish to teach in the State of Florida. The amount is \$4000 over a four-year period, \$1000 per year.

Eligibility Criteria

- ⇒ Seniors graduating from an accredited Florida high school (public/private)
- ⇒ Unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher
- ⇒ Minimum test scores –SAT 1000 or ACT 22
- ⇒ Must attend an accredited Florida college/university (public/private)
- ⇒ Must teach in Florida, following graduation. A copy of the OFFICIAL FLORIDA PROFESSIONAL TEACHING CERTIFICATE must be sent to the State FREA Office. The scholarship requires recipients to teach in the State of Florida for one year for every year the scholarship was awarded.

Application Process

Deadline: January 20, 2023 for application. Other supporting documents must be in by January 31, 2023.
