Lobbying for Retired Educators

What a fabulous opportunity I was given March 28 and 29 in Tallahassee. I had the extreme pleasure of attending as a delegate to the Florida Legislature session as a representative for FREA District 6. As a former Civics teacher, this was something I had always told my students they should do, to become involved in government and let their voices be heard.

I was extremely fortunate to have the mentorship of Susan and John Darovec from District 9 in Manatee County. As we set up appointments with our legislators from Hernando, Pasco, Hillsborough, Pinellas, Manatee, Charlotte, and Sarasota counties, I was given a first-hand look at how the legislative process really works.

My first appointment was with Representative Yeager from Pasco County. I was pleasantly surprised to find that while I was talking to him about opportunities for moving high school students onto a fast track in education, his wife was actually a teacher at my former school. Making that connection with Representative Yeager made the rest of our 20 minute meeting a breeze.

While all of our ideas may not have made it into the legislative session, it seemed that throughout the day, whether we were speaking to representatives or their legislative aides, they were all actively listening, taking notes, and asking pertinent questions.

By the end of Tuesday afternoon, I had the opportunity to meet with nine different representatives from both parties. Almost every one of them was in some way connected to public education through their parents, their spouse, their siblings, or themselves.

On Tuesday evening, I had a wonderful dinner with my fellow delegates, and we discussed our successes and challenges from the day. While the weather turned stormy, it did little to dampen my spirits.

On Wednesday, I was able to meet with 10 additional representatives and senators from both sides of the aisle. While many of the issues we were discussing were not already on the legislative agenda, I did feel as though some of the things that we talked about sparked the interest of both representatives and senators, and may possibly become issues they work on in the future. One of the more intriguing ideas regarding teacher retention that seem to spark interest was hiring retired teachers as part-time mentors in schools so that full-time teachers could focus on their own classrooms, while retired teachers could focus on helping new teachers find their way through the maze of educational directives, lesson planning, data collection and classroom management.

A second idea that seem to gather some steam was the idea of new teacher academies at high schools. This is a program that is doing well in Pasco County, and many legislators seem to be interested in this program. I was more than happy to provide them with the names of River Ridge High School and Beth Hess. My hope is that they will contact her to find out what great things she is doing with our future educators. Several legislators asked me to send them data regarding how that program is working and how many students have gone into the educational programs at college and have come back with a degree.




