Legislative Updates Fall 2023

This year the Florida Legislative Session begins on January 9th. However, many bills are formed during the Committee Weeks, November 6-17. The FREA State Legislative Committee will meet with their local legislators at their home offices in November and December, and we ask that you meet with yours also. How? Go to the FREA Legislative page scroll down and click on the links to Find Your Senator, or Find Your Senator, or Find Your Senator.

Recently the FREA Legislative group had a Zoom meeting where we discussed the issues we would like to address this year. Handouts for all of these issues can be found on the FREA website under the Legislative heading. www.frea.org/legislative

Our legislative advocacy for you centers around protecting the FRS pension and reinstating the COLA, which will both help current retirees and in recruiting and retaining teachers.

- 1. Re-instating Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA). This program ended in Florida during the 2011 Legislative session. This is supplemental income made to your pension to counteract the effects of inflation. If you retired after 2011, your COLA is calculated on the number of years you worked prior to July, 2011. People hired after July, 2011 do not receive a COLA. Last year it was suggested we re-instate COLA retroactive to 2011. This did not move forward because of the cost of implementation. We believe a COLA would encourage people to stay in teaching, thus retaining teachers.
- 2. Increase salaries for veteran teachers. Currently the Governor has increased the salary of beginning teachers, but not veteran teachers. In many instances, new teachers are making salaries equal or close to teachers who have worked for many years. We plan on suggesting an across the board salary increase of \$500 for each year taught. This means a 20 year teacher would receive a salary increase of \$10,000. We know this is asking for big \$\$\$ but you need to start somewhere.
- 3. **Reduce the time a teacher needs to sit out after they have ended DROP.** Currently a person who retired from FRS cannot work for a year. With our large teacher and substitute shortage, we need people to return to the classroom ASAP. We are suggesting to go back to the prior waiting period of 1 month for teachers.
- 4. We are asking the default be moved back to the pension plan. Several years ago the Legislature voted to change the FRS default into the investment plan. This means if a new teacher does not request to be in the pension plan, they are automatically placed into the investment plan. It has been proven that retirees are better off with the pension plan and third party investors make more money if new hires are placed on the investment plan. If new people do not enter the pension plan, it will eventually effect the pensions of all State employees in the FRS, including first responders, administrative, and all education system employees. outstanding pensions.
- 5. Did you know that retired education system employees in Florida make up over 80% of the Florida Retirement System? This gives you enormous legislative strength in Tallahassee, IF you choose to use it. In the coming months, we will ask you to write or call your legislators asking them to support our proposed changes if they become bills. FREA has over 11,000 members and we vote. Our past successes show that they will listen to us, especially if we *all* contact them!

FREF's 2023-2024 Scholarship Process

Presidents, please make sure that your current FREF Unit Chairs have received the updated scholarship information. All FREF Unit Chairs and their local high schools should currently have our 2023-2024 packet.

Please visit the FREA website and check out the Scholarship page. It is expected that students with technology will complete the online version of the application. This is the better method, given the fact the some recent mailings have caused students to miss deadlines. However, we have added a hard copy option for school personnel to access for students who do not have the technology. We want everyone to have access to our scholarship application, technology or not.

Current Scholarship Criteria

- ◆Seniors graduating from an accredited Florida high school (public or private)
- ♦ Unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher
- ♦ Minimum test scores –SAT 1000 or ACT 22
- ◆ MUST attend an accredited Florida college/university (public/private).
- ♦ MUST teach in Florida, following graduation. A copy of the OFFICIAL FLORIDA PROFESSIONAL TEACHING CERTIFICATE must be sent to the State FREA Office. The scholarship requires recipients to teach in the State of Florida for one year for every year the scholarship was awarded. If not, they must repay any scholarship monies received. Application, directions, and a list of required information can be found at: www.frea.org/scholarships







Our Convention Committee simplified the Unit display idea, and we are so looking forward to seeing your creations at Convention 2024!


