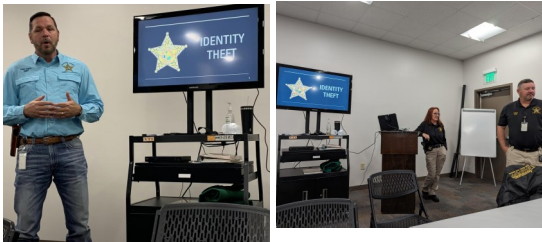
A presentation was made to the group by **Michelle Walker-Crawford** about her new tutoring service starting Wed, Jan 17th called The Learning Curve.

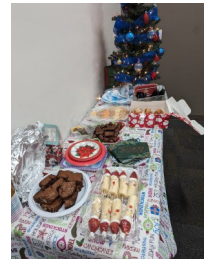
L-GREA Activities
