Eldon Weaver, NPCREA member and District 6 Volunteer Services Coordinator, volunteers with Oldsmar Cares all year long.

Eldon helps two days per week, collecting and cooking food for the homeless every Monday night and delivering and serving it at Williams Park in downtown St.

At Oldsmar Care headquarters, he unloads trucks of donated food from Walmart, Publix, Feeding

Tampa Bay, and other surplus food suppliers. He cooks food at home from whatever is donated, including vegetarian food for those who require it, takes the food, donuts, and sweets to Williams Park every Monday night all year round.

On his other volunteer day he unloads trucks for Oldsmar Cares and shelves items in their food pantry and clothing store and toy shop. This year, Oldsmar Cares collected almost 1000 toys for the Oldsmar Toy Drive.

Founded in 1997, Oldsmar Cares is a 100% volunteer run 501(c)(3) nonprofit serving Oldsmar and the surrounding zip codes of 34695, 33635, and 34684. Oldsmar Cares provides financial assistance, food, health screenings, and clothing to those in need in the area.



On Tuesday, Nov. 14, Linda McGeehan gave the Thought for the day about the great patriotism



shown by our American veterans. She included quotes by Arther Ashe, Woodrow Wilson, and Ronald Reagan.

Sharon Ozbun, our vice-president, introduced Judy Silverstein Gray, Coast Guard veteran and

author of Unwavering, a non-fiction book about the struggle of wives of American forces missing in action in the Vietnam War. She spoke ardently about the plight of military wives whose husbands



were held captive in North Vietnam and Cambodia. Many of these wives became anti-war activists and advocates for racial and gender parity. Copies of the book were on sale for \$28, signed by the author.

Bob Stephens asked for a volunteer to train to be treasurer starting in May 2023. Marie Grein gave the Treasurer's Report, showing a balance of \$7133.56 in our checking account, with \$2000 encumbered for scholarships, leaving available for use, \$5133.56.
