It's grand public buildings, palaces, rich cultural history, and museums tell it's 700-year-old history beautifully. 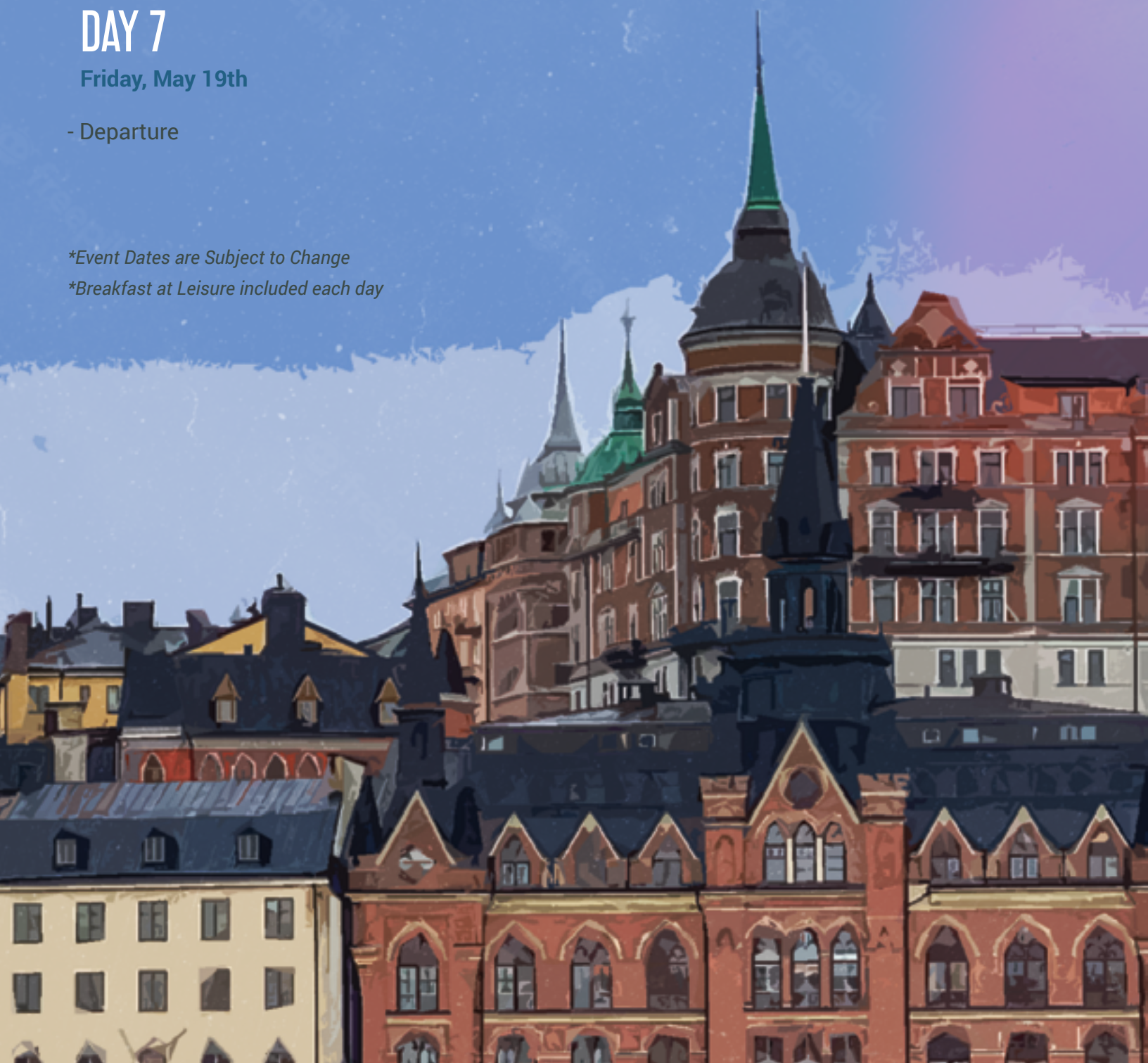

Vasa Museum: Dinner and Tour

Enjoy a spectacular tour and dinner at The Vasa Museum. The Museum houses the warship 'Vasa', which sank in Stockholm's inner harbour on her maiden voyage in 1628; its discovery in 1956, and subsequent salvage in 1961, is one of the most important events in marine archaeology. Painstakingly restored to much of its original magnificence, the Vasa represents an authentic piece of living history. A dinner in the Main Hall overlooking the striking, fully intact 17th century ship, will be one for the books!



Archipelago Boat Tour, Drottningholm Palace and Lunch

Cruise the beautiful archipelago of Stockholm to Vaxholm and back aboard the magnificent flagship, M/S Waxholm. Make a stop at Sweden's preserved Drottningholm Castle. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Drottningholm Castle's complex, and gardens, are a striking representation of timeless European royal architecture. Back onboard, dine amongst breathtaking views of the surrounding sandy beaches, rocky cliffs, wooded islands, and rugged nature. Delectable dishes are curated with satisfaction and sustainability in mind, using only the freshest ingredients delivered to the ship each morning and prepared as per order on board.





A 'Nobel' Dinner Event

The Hall of Mirrors (Spegelsalen) at The Grand Hotel, is a ballroom rich in history and style. The location of the very first Nobel Prize Ceremony, the Spegelsalen, is styled after the Galerie des Glaces at Versailles. THINGS TO KNOW

Passport/VISA Info: Canadians travelling to Sweden will require a minimum of 6 months validity on their passport. A visa is not required for Canadians to travel to Sweden if your visit is less than 3 months.

Currency: Swedish Krona (SEK) is the preferred method of payment. Most places will accept credit/debit cards. ATMs are commonly found throughout the country.

Official language: Swedish

Water: It is safe to drink the tap water anywhere in Sweden - it is ranked among the best in the world.

Electric Current: 230V at 50 Hz. An adapter is required for all electronics and a converter is recommended for more powerful devices.

Time Zone: Daylight savings time begins from the last Sunday in March (02:00 CET) to the last Sunday in October (03:00 CEST). Otherwise, it is Central European Time (CET; UTC+01:00)

The Nordic Food Walk Stockholm

Sample the best of Stockholm's cuisine on this half-day walking tour.
