

"THEY STOLE MY STIMULUS CHECK!"

"I cried all day!"

Krystle Phelps of Oklahoma discovered her \$3,400 government "stimulus" check had been stolen by someone else who filed taxes claiming to be her husband. He used this stolen identity to steal the money. Thieves have used stolen personal information and email tricks to rob consumers in tremendous numbers. The FTC reported four times more complaints on identity theft in April as in the first three months of 2020 combined.

Why? First, hackers have stolen data on individuals from dozens of data breaches in the past few years. Many thefts include all the information they need to file for stimulus checks.

The coronavirus has made it easier. Scammers are bombarding consumers with emails and robocalls that claim personal information is required to get the money.

"Mrs. Smith, this is the CDC. We are sending out the stimulus money but we need your checking account number to deposit the money electronically."

That's not all. The IRS has set up a portal for the 70 million folks who did not already have their personal information on file. To get "your" check, all you need is to go on the website and give your Social Security number, address, phone number, and date of birth. Hackers who have stolen this information can easily file and claim thousands of dollars.

And what if you haven't received your money and you are worried. You go online to websites with names like "Whereismystimulus" or

"2020reliefprogram". These websites, set up by crooks, **look official** and claim to help you file for your money. But as soon as you give them your personal information, they file for you themselves and steal your cash.
