AS DMVS MOVE SERVICES ONLINE, Start With Trust AS DMVS CASH IN WITH LOOKALIKE SITES

To help slow the spread of COVID-19, state departments of motor vehicles (DMVs) around the United States, and the Registry of Motor Vehicles in Canada, have expanded their online offerings, allowing drivers to book appointments or pre-pay for services.

Unfortunately, scammers are using this opportunity to trick drivers with lookalike websites that steal money and personal information, according to new reports filed by consumers on <u>BBB.org/ScamTracker</u>.

How the Scam Works

You need to change your car's title, get a <u>Real ID</u>, or perform another service that you would normally do at your local motor vehicles office. Instead, you visit what you <u>think</u> is the motor vehicles website to learn about their new COVID-19 procedures. Your state may now allow you to complete the transaction online, or you may need to schedule an in-person appointment through the motor vehicle website.

But before you enter any personal or payment information, double check the site's URL to make sure it's the real deal. Scammers are taking advantage of the new online services by creating phony sites that claim to handle your license renewal or car title transfer. However, these cons really just steal your money and personal information, putting you at risk of identity theft.

For example, one victim thought they had pre-paid for a driver's license renewal online, according to a <u>BBB.org/ScamTracker</u> report. But when they arrived at the DMV office to complete the transaction, the clerk had no record of the payment. Turns out, the victim paid a scam lookalike website instead.

How to Avoid Falling Victim to a Fake Website

- Double check the URL before you enter personal and payment information. It can be easy to click on a sponsored ad or imposter website without noticing. Before you enter any sensitive information, double check that you are on the right website and that the link is secure. (Secure links start with "https://" and include a lock icon on the purchase page. Learn more at <u>BBB.org/BBBSecure</u>.)
- Be wary of third-party websites. Some websites appear to offer a legitimate service but are only fronts for a scam. Be suspicious of websites with no working customer service number and no physical address. Typos and grammatical errors can be indications of a scammer's handiwork, too.
- Make online purchases with your credit card. Fraudulent charges made on a credit card can usually be disputed, whereas that might not be the case with other payment methods. Unfortunately, there is no way to get back the personal information you may have shared.



August TechCred Round to Upskill Over 4,400 Ohio Employees

Program now committed to funding over 10,000 credentials, marking milestone

(COLUMBUS, Ohio)—Lt. Governor Jon Husted, who serves as Director of the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation, announced that following the August round of TechCred, 288 Ohio companies have been approved for funding, which will help their current and incoming workforce earn the skills needed for the increasingly tech-infused economy.

"Before being elected, Governor DeWine and I promised to create a program to help Ohioans renew their skills and put them on track to a better career," said Lt. Governor Jon Husted. "Today, I am excited that we reached our goal of funding over 10,000 upskilling opportunities. When these students complete their certificates, more than 10,000 Ohioans with better skills, earning power, and job security."

The most recent TechCred application period closed at the end of August. Today, 288 Ohio employers were approved for funding, resulting in Ohio employees earning up to 4,468 technology-focused credentials. The August round was record-setting, approving 1,227 more credentials than were approved in June 2020, which previously held the award record.

"TechCred is helping Ohio businesses upskill their workforce," said Lydia Mihalik, Director of the Ohio Development Services Agency. "Credentials earned through this program help employees and businesses prepare for a brighter future.

"With the approvals announced today, a total of 983 Ohio employers have been approved for funding, supporting the earning of 11,941 tech-focused credentials by Ohio employees. This round marks a milestone as funding has been approved for over 10,000 credentials.

The sixth TechCred application period opens today, Thursday, October 1st and closes October 30th.

"The strength of Ohio's economy hinges on a skilled workforce, and the continued growth of TechCred reinforces that idea," said Ohio Department of Higher Education Chancellor Randy Gardner. "It is great to see so many Ohio employers and their workers taking advantage of this program, which will help ensure their success now and in the future."


