

It was just October of last year when the former Clark's Food Mart closed until Mr. Khanal reopened it as the Ogden Mart earlier this year. The Boone County Chamber and Ogden Ambassadors celebrated its ribbon cutting in January. According to a story in the Ogden Reporter the community has supported a local grocery store for well over 100 years and has shown an outpouring of support for Mr. Khanal. As of Wednesday the 6<sup>th</sup> Walnut Street was still blocked off to traffic and the fire was still smoldering under the pile of bricks with investigators keeping the public away until a thorough investigation can be conducted on it's cause.

Madrid's Christmas Extravaganza has been set for Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup> with a visit from Santa Clause kicking things off at City State Bank in the morning, a vendor fair in the Madrid elementary Gym and a Christmas Tree Auction at the public library. 
#### **CVB** Happenings

Crossing Boone County

Did you know we have a famous highway crossing Boone County? *Lincoln Highway* was the first major transcontinental highway between New York and San Francisco. Opening in 1913, Lincoln Highway stretches 3,400 miles and was established to meet the growing needs of a small but growing number of car owners during the early part of the 20th century. What makes this roadway unique is that it is not your normal highway but a collection of roads that join communities. The highway passes through 14 states, 128 counties, and more than 700 cities, towns and villages. There are many interesting attractions and businesses along the route that cater to travelers.

Like the railroad, Lincoln Highway connects the communities of Boone and Ogden. The rails and roadways continue to be an important part of Boone County's history.


