Many people flock to our county to enjoy a peaceful float down the river, or a scenic bike ride across the High Trestle Trail Bridge. Others come for a memorable trip on the Boone and Scenic Valley Railroad. Still, others to camp, fish, hike or walk through our amazing (there's that word again!) collection of historical museums. Along the way, they enjoy a wide array of homegrown restaurants and unique local shopping. We hope you'll make us a part of your next trip. We think you'll agree that Boone County is an amazing place!

MADRID (pronounced (MAD-rid) is an energetic, growing community in the southeast corner of Boone County. The continued development of the High Trestle Trail, which cuts through its center along the downtown's south side attracts tens of thousands of people each year. This 25-mile trail has received international recognition for its centerpiece, the **High Trestle Trail Bridge**, which sits just over two miles to Madrid's west and at 130' high, spans the valley at one-half mile long! **Dalander Park** is a favorite spot to park, offload the bikes and head down the trail in either direction. Plenty of food and beverages are available from many local establishments situated a stone's throw from the trail. Didn't bring a bike? Don't worry, they've got bike rentals covered too! Madrid **Labor Day Celebration** runs from Friday-Monday Labor Day Weekend and the **Christmas Extravaganza** is the first Saturday of December.



The paved recreational trail opened April 30, 2011, and has had countless pedestrians bask in the beauty that is the thirteen-story bridge that overlooks the Des Moines River Valley. The 25-mile trail goes from Ankeny to the south, through the cities of Slater & Madrid before ending in Woodward, lowa to the west. The focal point to the High Trestle Trail is the bridge itself which features cribbing on the deck directly above the water that is lined with Blue LED lights. This serves to illuminate the deck as well as mirror the water flowing below. The lights are made to be turned on and off for events and minimize disruption to the wildlife in the valley. From April 1 until October 31, the bridge lights are on from sunset to 12:00 a.m., then during the winter months from approximately November 1 through March 31 from sunset until 9:00 p.m. The elevated columns supporting the bridge are all gently down-lit to cast an aura of light onto the valley floor. Entering into the bridge, two 36 feet tall monoliths stand on either side that form an enormous V. More than 16,000 custom-glazed ceramic tiles were created in the RDG Art Studio and made specifically to look like coal. These tiles were placed onto the monoliths to represent the veins of coal running through the region. The High Trestle Trail Bridge has been named the best bike accessible bridge in Iowa by the Iowa Bicycle Coalition several times, and was named by the BBC as one of the worlds eight most amazing footbridges. Come see this amazing attraction in Boone County!



Founded in 1968, the **IOWA ARBORETUM AND GARDENS** has become Iowa's premier public garden. Located near Madrid, the 40 acres of beautifully landscaped gardens and grounds features plants, both native and introduced to Iowa. Visitors walking the circular trail system can see the Arboretum's major collections of trees, shrubs and flowers along with significant collections of dwarf conifers, hostas and daylilies. The **Children's Garden** will entertain the youngest of guests with a secret tunnel, one-room schoolhouse playhouse and gardens. Across from the main campus, visitors can stroll along extensive trails in a native Iowa woodland and prairie.

Modern facilities are available for hosting meetings, retreats, parties and weddings. Find unique home and garden décor at the Arboretum's gift shop. Special events, educational workshops and plant sales are offered throughout the year. Guided tours are available for individuals of all ages (call for a reservation).



Swede Point Park



This little known piece of heaven is located in southern Boone County, just a mile north of state Highway 210 near the Des Moines River Valley. **SWEDE POINT** gets its name from the Swedish settlers who located their families near this area in 1846.

The park features 24 electric camping sites with new gravel pads and two non-electric camping areas. A modern bathroom and showering facility, two hiking trails, picnicking and updated playground equipment, basketball court, sand volleyball and an enclosed shelter house (reservations required).

The area terrain is a mix of prairie, streams, and oak-hickory woodlands and savannas. You will find a large array of wildlife here from deer and coyotes to owls and hummingbirds. The Des Moines River is just a short but challenging hike down into the deep valley, but well worth the effort. At the river you might find bald eagles, raccoon, pelicans, and more. If you are looking for a quiet get away, look no further than Swede Point Park.


Madrid History Museum



Heart of the County. Boone





The city remains intrinsically tied to its railroad heritage with many displays reflecting this history, as well as a major attraction, the **Boone & Scenic Valley Railroad** operating tourist excursions throughout the year into the nearby Des Moines River Valley. Boone is also host to one of the state's largest community festivals, appropriately named "Pufferbilly Days" after the little steam engines that were used in coal mines. With tons of neat specialty shops, and plenty of places to eat, drink or enjoy time with your family, Boone is a fantastic destination located in the heart of Boone County.





Boone County Economic Growth

The Boone County Economic Growth Corporation is the private-public partnership between Boone County, and the cities of Boone, Madrid and Ogden, along with a number of private businesses supporting its development efforts. In 2018 BCEGC announced the certification of the Boone Industrial Park – Phase II site, a strategically located industrial development near the I-35 and I-80 corridor, just a few minutes north of US Highway 30 in Boone, Iowa. This greenfield site is truly shovel-ready for light or heavy industrial development and is fed by short line rail provided by the BSVRR, and Union Pacific Railroad's transcontinental freight service. The property is within one mile of four-lane U.S. Highway 30 which connects directly to U.S. Interstate 35 only seventeen minutes to the east.

The city of Boone is Boone County's primary hub for commercial and industrial development with three distinct parks offering various options for development. Everything from a large manufacturing site, to a corporate office complex, to smaller commercial or light industrial needs. Boone County boasts an incredibly lush and diverse habitat along the Des Moines river valley, which provides a high quality of place with its numerous opportunities for outdoor recreation

year-round. The city of Boone was recently named, the best small-town in America by Realtor.com and the "best up and coming" housing market in Iowa by Insurify. Boone and Ogden are experiencing their most dramatic growth in new housing starts in years while the city of Madrid's Tiger Run development will offer up to forty-five new single-home lots by the end of 2021. Each of the communities are being wired for gigabit-speed internet with many areas already online. Boone County communities boast great public and private schools pre-K through 12 and the city of Boone is the site of a Des Moines Area Community College campus serving more than 3,000 students and housing all of the college system's athletic programs. Boone County sits immediately west of a major research institution, Iowa State University, and little more than one-half hour north of the Des Moines metro with a laborshed measured at over 420,000.







With miles of paths that take you high above the **sandstone cliffs**, to an overlook above the Des Moines River, into pristine backwoods, around hidden lakes, along small streams, there are endless activities to explore.

While hiking or picnicking, marvel at one of **the most unique geological wonders anywhere in lowa**, the Ledges Canyon. Mamie Geneva Doud, wife of Dwight David Eisenhower, 34th President of the United States, was born in Boone on November 14, 1896. She was the second of four daughters to Elivera Carlson and John Sheldon Doud.

The one story frame house has been restored to reflect the 1890s and contains a wide variety of family heirlooms. The site also includes a restored summer kitchen and carriage house with antique automobiles.

In 1952 "Ike" was elected President and re-elected again in 1956.

The Eisenhowers visited relatives in Boone often. Mamie's last visit here was in 1977.





Boone County Historical Society Where brave deeds & heroes meet

Take a look at the intriguing stories of Boone County as you journey back to central Iowa's bygone era set in the scenic river valley. The central holdings of the **Boone County historical collection** are maintained in a 1907 Masonic Temple that sets the stage for your discovery of the past. The History Center is a perfect stop for visitors of all ages who come to delight in stories about fascinating characters such as Kate Shelley, Mamie Eisenhower, and Carl Fritz Henning.

Observe the handwritten journals and **photographs** of the first and longest serving caretaker of Ledges State Park, consider first American industries that were developed at the turn of the 20th Century, realize the importance of natural resources in Boone's Des Moines river valley, and the bustling beginnings of downtown Boone.

The BOONE CO. HISTORICAL SOCIETY is

bus-tour friendly with a lower level community room available for group tours, reunions, social events, and business meetings, and is available year-round. The lower level offers a completely furnished and modern commercial kitchen equipped to serve up to 130 guests.



COLE SCHOOL

The Little Brick Schoolhouse on the Prairie

Cole School operated from 1888-1933

and is located northeast of Boone on R Avenue. This school is notable due to the unique brickwork of this historic structure that supports three layers of brick. The school was adopted by the De Shon Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) who completely and accurately restored the site. The restoration process at Cole School included extensive masonry work with complete tuck pointing, a whole new floor to replace the floor lost to time and elements, great cleaning (due to sheep once housed inside of Cole School for some time) and new blackboards which came from a local high school. School desks were acquired from local auctions, and a variety of books, school related artifacts, a potbelly stove and teacher supplies are all part of the Cole School collection. The Country School Association of American has recognized the facility on their national registry of rural school houses. DAR maintains the site and visits to Cole School can be arranged by contacting DAR Member: Marilyn Tagesen at 515.490.2207.

HICKORY GROVE SCHOOL

Slates and Schoolmates

Hickory Grove School was originally built in 1889 in the northeastern corner of Yell Township. A visit allows youngsters to sit in desks once occupied by students, and for guests of all ages to remember a time that echoes a simpler era that can feel both comforting and primitive. Historical maps, world globes, teaching tools, school primers, encyclopedias and a variety of country school artifacts amplify a **collection that spans from 1889 to 1956**. The museum now sits on the site of the Battin Chapel, which contains a well-preserved railroad depot in addition to the chapel and school. Boone History Museums and the Battin Heritage Association jointly sponsor the museum located at the juncture of old Highway 30 (E41) and J Avenue between Ogden and Boone.

July 6, 1881, is a date forever rooted in Boone County's history. As the shadow of midnight encroached on the landscape of the river valley of Moingona, Iowa, and a ferocious storm raged in the vicinity of the Shelley Homestead, 15-year-old Kate Shelley was considering the fates of others.

Dressed in a simple prairie dress, Kate Shelley left the safety of her home in the pelting rain. Crawling across the Des Moines River Bridge under thundering skies and over frothing black waters

that lapped beneath her, she advanced to save the lives of those in danger in an oncoming train. Kate Shelley's bravery made her instantly famous from California to New York where her story played out in national headlines. The medals she received for heroism are on display at the **Boone Co. Historical Society**, along with the lantern she carried that night. Other mementos and accolades of her heroic act can be viewed at the Park and Museum.

fortune in the meat packing industry, Doud moved his family to Colorado where they eventually settled in Denver. However, Mamie never lost contact with her mother's Boone family, the Carlsons. Throughout the 1940s to the 1960s, the Eisenhower family regularly visited Boone. After Ike's death in 1969, the Eisenhower family frequently visited Boone. Mamie continued to return to Boone, making her last trip in 1977, two years before her own death.

Over the years, the Birthplace was inhabited by many families, at one time housing three individual apartments that meant extremely close quarters for residents. By 1970, the Eisenhower Birthplace home was set for demolition and local citizens were quick to sound the alarm. The Friends of the Mamie Doud Eisenhower Birthplace raised thousands of dollars to obtain the home, and the land was donated for the relocation of The Birthplace in 1975 to a location across the street. Following five years of restoration, the Mamie Doud Eisenhower Birthplace opened on June 22, 1980.



Mamie Geneva Doud was born on November 14, 1896, at 718 Carroll St. in Boone. Mamie was the second of four daughters born to Elvera Mathilde (Carlson) and John Sheldon Doud. She grew up to become the wife of the 34th president of the United States, Dwight David Eisenhower.

While Mamie was still an infant, the Douds moved from Boone to Cedar Rapids. In 1905, after making a
