The Chamber is governed by a 12-member Board of Directors and also operates the Boone County Convention and Visitors Bureau and the Pufferbilly Days^(TM) festival. It boasts 277 businesses, non-profits and individuals within its membership.

On August 10th a rare storm packing winds in excess of 90 m.p.h. ("derecho") roared through Boone County damaging trees, cars and buildings. The Heartland Co-op in Luther was one of the hardest hit businesses.

The Board of Directors chipped in to help the Boone Rotary Club with their centennial "Welcome Train" project by donating \$650 to the cause. The Train, comprised of a steam locomotive engine, coal tender and passenger car, was moved into place at US Highway 30 and South Story Street July 22nd and 23rd. from the desk of the director



THE FIGHT OF OUR (BUSINESS) LIVES

In no uncertain terms, 2020 has been like a Muhammad Ali right hook to our

lives, affecting the physical and mental health of citizens across the globe, while crushing the collective economic well-being of business and industry. That left us with a choice: hide behind our gloves or punch back.

Soon after the magnitude of the pandemic's impact was understood, congress rushed to rescue small business through trillion-dollar relief programs, and proclamations were being handed down from state government, so did the Boone County Chamber quickly enact programs and communication to help our area's retail and service sector.

Right out of the gate we modified our annual **March Shop Mania** program to highlight the Chamber's retail and service industry members and infused more than \$2,000 into the local economy through our Gift Check program. Then, in April we were excited to work with Fareway Stores and distribute another \$2,000 in grocery gift cards to area business owners and their employees who were already beginning to feel the pinch of closures and mandates.

Before April had closed we had added yet another program to help local retailers called, **Central Iowa Shop Where I Live**. Central Iowa Shop Where I Live is an e-commerce platform designed for 'mainstreet' businesses that may not have the time, resources or money to set

fund became transformational when the Boone City Council committed \$25,000 to the fund from their emergency reserves in early July. This extra infusion of cash allowed for more substantial grant awards and the ability to help many more affected businesses



up and manage an online store. Thanks to underwriting from Boone County Economic Growth Corporation we were able to offer this to our members at no cost.

But, probably the program I am most proud of is our **Small Business Assistance Fund**, launched over social media on March 30th. The Chamber seeded the fund with the first \$500, then sought donations from the public and private business. Within a few weeks we had surpassed \$10,000 raised, mainly on the strength of two major contributions from APEX Clean Energy, the firm working to build a wind farm in northern Boone County, and the Boone County Economic Growth Corporation. The across the county.

To date, thirty businesses have received a total of \$33,000!

While the fund balance is diminishing, the need for cash for small business to survive the economic crisis of the pandemic has not. Exactly where the Chamber goes from here to keep helping businesses navigate arguably their toughest stretch since the Great Depression, I don't know. But I can promise you this: The board and staff of the Chamber will keep swinging until the bell rings in this fight.



DMACC STUDENT CENTER NEARS COMPLETION

The Boone campus of Des Moines Area Community College is about to realize a dream that has been in the making for at least a couple of decades - the addition of a long-awaited student activity and

wellness center. At 28,500 sq. ft. the center will be able to accommodate an entirely new gymnasium, weight room, athletic training rooms, baseball and softball practice areas and a golf simulator, along with additional storage and office space. The center is being built at a price tag of \$6.5 million with many generous donations, including a \$250,000 gift from Fareway Stores, paving the way for its construction. HIGHWAY 17 GRADE SEPARATION PROJECT TIMETABLE MOVED UP

The Iowa Department of Transportation Commission has moved up the timetable for the proposed grade separation at State Highway 17 and the Union Pacific Railroad tracks at the "S" Avenue crossing.

According to IDOT Engineer Tony Gustafson, the department is planning to begin the bid-letting process in January of next year, with construction to commence in the spring of 2021, and expected completion of the bridge and roads by the end of 2022.

IDOT has long desired to improve the safety at this intersection, a known trouble spot for accidents and traffic congestion over the years. Along with improved safety, the overpass will also eliminate traffic stoppage at UPRR crossings and provide better access to the Boone Industrial Park.

According to engineering firm Snyder & Associates, the bridge will span 410' and allow for the additoon of a third track.


