The January 2024 Central Washington University Student Price Index shows a 1.6 percent increase in the cost of living compared to January 2023, with the most significant increases being in coffee, take-out, and housing. This is the second month in a row that the SPI has recorded lower levels of annual inflation than the CPI. The SPI estimate this month is lower than the estimated price increases for the Pacific Northwest and the CPI (the average American), which saw increases of 3.4 percent, and 3.1 percent, respectively.

## THE SPI PROJECT

This project, led jointly by the Economics Association and the Department of Economics at CWU, develops a price index of the cost of college living in Ellensburg, Washington.
