Chellie Cameron, CEO, Philadelphia Airport to Keynote Business University

Chellie Cameron, CEO of the Philadelphia Airport will be the keynote speaker for this year's Business University. Ms. Cameron has been at the helm of the Airport since 2016 leading a team of over 900 employees serving 31.7 million passengers annually. She is responsible for the directing, planning, and development of all activities at the airport, which includes working with 25 airlines with over 500 flights daily. Ms. Cameron, an accountant by trade and former active duty officer in the United States Air Force will share her story of what it takes to lead the county's 20th busiest airport to be a major economic driver for the region, generating over \$15 billion in revenue and supporting more than 96,000 full time jobs.

Business University also includes breakout sessions on topics such as Marketing on a Shoestring Budget, Ransomware, The Art of Negotiation, How to Win Business through Storytelling, Leadership and Management, and Managing Constructive Criticism.

UNDERSTANDING HIPAA IN THE WORKPLACE

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, or "HIPAA", as it is frequently called, is a law that establishes policies and regulations that ensure the health and personal data of individuals is protected. As an employer, it is important to know that you can incur significant penalties for failure to comply with the aspects of this law.

HIPAA applies to any entity that handles the flow of patient and personal information. Accordingly, protected health information can include:

- Any discussions concerning treatment involving the patient, doctors, nurses or other medical personnel
- Any personal details of an individual including the patient's full name, date of birth or social security number
- Medical information, including details of treatment, diagnosis or health history

It is critical that you and your employees understand that this sensitive information must always be kept safe. Precautions should be in place to protect employee and dependents personal data, health records and information acquired through employee physicals, workers' compensation claims or as the result of a workplace injury covered by OSHA.

Some of the important things every business should do to be HIPAA compliant is:

- Establish policies and procedures for safe handling of sensitive data
- Implement security awareness training for all employees
- Perform an annual risk assessment
- Assure that encryption is used for all methods of data transfer

Although it can be a challenge for small businesses to be HIPAA compliant with their limited resources, the good news is that My Benefit Advisor (MBA) can be a valuable resource and can assist you in your efforts. 
