In addition, webinars on legal concerns, the Paycheck Protection Plan, marketing and networking opportunities were held. Members offered discounts on products and needed services to assist others with reopening. We're Open Again posters were created and distributed throughout the re-



gion to welcome customers back while assuring that the proper CDC guidelines were being followed.

The Chamber continues to be an advocate for the Montgomery County business community through providing support for several letters to state legislators as well as the governors office to express member concerns. A program was presented with U.S. Representatives Dean and Fitzpatrick for a Washington update and Q&A session.
