





PUBLIC SAFETY



GULF SHORES POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Gulf Shores Police Department has begun the process for National Accreditation through the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA)
- Only about 5 percent of all local, state and federal agencies in the United States have achieved the CALEA mark of distinction

GULF SHORES FIRE RESCUE

- 25% of the Department are Certified Smoke Divers
 - One of the highest percentages in the state
 - Less than 1% of firefighters are certified
- **ISO 1 Classification** *Highest Rating Possible*
- 67% of department are nationally registered paramedics and it will be 85% by the end of the year
- 6 full-time and 30+ seasonal lifeguards all certified at the highest level of USLA
 - 137 Total Rescues 2022
 - 100 Rescues in so far 2023
- New Training Facility will provide opportunities to maintain standards of excellence
