

The number of businesses holding a lease in a commercial property in Federal Way. **Source:** CoStar business tenant survey list




Have you experienced **CUSTOMER OR CLIENT COMPLAINTS** related to homelessness in the past 12 months?


Have you received **STAFF COMPLAINTS** related to homelessness in the past 12 months?


In the past 12 months, has your business **EXPERIENCED ANY OF THESE PROBLEMS** associated with homelessness?


Has your business seen a **LOSS OF REVENUE** due to homelessness? Estimate the cost.

Have you, your staff or your customers **FELT UNSAFE** operating your business?






Have you seen an increase or decrease in the **NUMBER OF HOMELESS** persons in or around your business in the last 12 months?




Have you had to **CALL THE POLICE** due to homeless disruptions?








Have you considered **LEAVING FEDERAL WAY** to open a business elsewhere due to homelessness concerns?


of respondents believe it is the primary responsibility of the CITY to address homelessness.


