Commitment

Attendance at the orientation, monthly sessions from February through November and a graduation program in December are mandatory. Persons who cannot adjust their schedules to accommodate these days should not apply. Class members are expected to attend each day session in its entirety. Leadership Academy participants are required to allocate 24 hours of volunteer service of which 8 hours are allocated to the Smith Mountain Lake Regional Chamber of Commerce events or SML Visitor Center and 16 hours to an organization of your choosing. Additionally, participants are expected to attend at minimum one (1) Smith Mountain Lake Regional Chamber of Commerce networking forum each month: Franklin County Connects (second Wednesday each month from 9 – 10am), Business After Hours (third Thursday each month from 5 – 7am) or SML Connects Road Show (fourth Thursday each month from 9 – 10am).

In order to successfully complete the Smith Mountain Lake Leadership Academy program, attendance is expected at all scheduled sessions. Failure to attend all sessions may result in participant's ineligibility to graduate from the program. The Smith Mountain Lake Regional Chamber realizes that unexpected situations may arise that result in participant's inability to attend. In such instances the Chamber's Education Committee will evaluate the absence on a case-by-case basis.
