

Ask SCORE: Keep Insurance Coverage Current

A great investment in small business insurance protects everything you've done to make your business successful. However, the policy you bought when you were starting out might not be sufficient for your current needs: review it periodically for all valid risks.

As your business grows, you may have added new services and specialized equipment that require policy endorsements or modifications.

Disaster and business interruption insurance is also becoming a must for business owners concerned about damage or a prolonged shutdown resulting from natural disasters, incidents such as a toxic spill or transportation disruption, or acts of terrorism

Consider all the possible ways of holding down the costs. Cover the most risky and largest perils first, then work down your list of priorities, but don't overlook seemingly minor risks simply for the sake of saving money. Use a deductible as high as you feel your cash flow and savings will allow.

Making wise insurance decisions is easier when you work with a reputable and qualified broker agent or consultant. A search feature at www.iiaa.org, the site of the Independent Insurance Agents of America, will help you find qualified professionals in your community.

Note that many small business policies offer the option of adding riders as opposed to buying separate policies.

Are You "In Group?"

Group-experience-rating permits both public and private employers with betterthan-average claim histories to join

together through MACC. This results in BWC rating each employer in the group as one. By participating in group rating, employers potentially may enjoy much lower premium rates than they could attain on their own. An employer's workers' compensation coverage is still through BWC; however, BWC does not form the groups.

BWC designed group-experience rating as an incentive program to promote and reward employers who have and maintain safe working conditions. The groupexperience rating discount is similar to a good-driver discount you may receive on your auto insurance premium based on your driving experience. On the other hand, employers with a worse-thanaverage safety record or are experiencing higher claims costs may have to pay a higher premium amount.

MACC has been a partner with Care-WorksComp for decades. Approximately \$400,000 was saved by MACC members through this plan last year.

How To Structure Your Business

Proprietorship. Partnership. S corporation. Limited liability company. C corporation. Which form is best for your new business? The decision can be difficult. Each business form offers you both advantages and disadvantages.

Proprietorships and Partnerships

A sole proprietorship is a simple and inexpensive way to begin operating a business. Unless you operate the business under a name other than your own, generally no legal documents or forms need to be filed other than any licenses or permits required by your state or local government. As the sole proprietor, you have complete control over the business. However, a sole proprietorship is limited to one owner. So, if you have multiple owners, or expect to in the near future, a sole proprietorship isn't right for you.

With a sole proprietorship, business income is reported on your personal federal income-tax return and taxed at personal income-tax rates rather than corporate rates. If your business is a partnership, it must file a partnership return, but your allocable share of the business' income, losses, deductions, and credits passes through to you to be reported on your personal tax return.

The greatest disadvantage of a sole proprietorship or partnership is that, as the owner or general partner, you are personally liable for all obligations of the business. Creditors of the business can go after your personal assets if the business assets are not sufficient to cover the business' debt liabilities.

Incorporating your business limits your personal liability for business obligations, but generally involves greater start-up and operating expenses, as well as added paperwork. A corporation is a Any discussion pertaining to taxes in this distinct legal entity that is responsible for paying its own debts and obligations. Shareholders risk communication may be part of a promotion only the loss of the funds they have invested.

C Corporations. A C corporation is taxed separately from its owners at corporate tax rates. This can result in double taxation. Corporate income may be taxed once to the corporation and again to the shareholders when it is paid out as dividends or the corporation liquidates. The corporation cannot deduct these dividend payments. However, it can deduct reasonable compensation paid to you and other owners. So, small corporations often pay out all or most of their net income to the owners as compensation, especially if the owners' top personal tax rate is lower than the corporation's rate. (The top federal personal rate is 39.6% in 2014, while the corporate federal tax rates vary significantly, based on taxable corporate income. The highest corporate federal tax rates may or marketing effort. As provided for in govbe as high as 35%.)

S Corporations. With an S corporation, income, losses, deductions, and credits pass through to you and other owners to be reported on your federal tax returns just as they do with a partnership. Thus, S corporation income generally is taxed only once. Businesses operating as S corporations must meet several special requirements. For example, an S corporation cannot have more than one Individuals should seek advice based on their class of stock outstanding nor more than 100 shareholders. (A husband and wife are considered one shareholder.) Also, unlike other business forms, it cannot selectively allocate income and deductions.

Limited Liability Company

As an alternative to incorporation, consider operating your business as a limited liability company (LLC). For the most part, forming an LLC is simpler and involves less paperwork than incorporating your business. Like a corporation, an LLC provides owners with protection from personal liability for business debts and obligations.

However, most LLC owners can choose to have their businesses treated as partnerships for federal income-tax purposes. Partnership treatment means that income, losses, deductions, and credits pass through to the individual owners (called "members") to be reported on their individual income-tax returns, so LLC income is not subject to double taxation. Partnership tax treatment also permits an LLC to specially allocate income and expenses among its owners to the same extent Financial Securities Corp for its representathat a partnership can.
