2018 Tax Implications for Small Business Why Small Businesses Will Thrive in 2018

The recent tax reform of 2018, the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA), delivers two major changes that affect the business world in the United States.

- Corporations now receive a flat tax rate of 21%. This is a permanent change to the Corporate Tax Rate.
- Pass-through entities, such as sole proprietors and LLCs, receive a 20% deduction. This change is temporary, lasting through 2025.

What the New Tax Law Means for Small Business

The benefits to corporations are obvious. With Corporate Tax Rates previously falling between 15% - 39%, the flat rate of 21% frees up needed capital for more expansion, improvements and employee retention.

The benefit to small businesses, although temporary, still delivers an exciting opportunity for growth and expansion. This law provides a 20% deduction in taxable income as long as total taxable income for a single taxpayer is less than \$157,500 for the year, or less than \$315,000 for married taxpayers filing a joint return.

The 2018 Tax Law Figures Explained

The amount eligible for this 20% deduction is a business's Qualified Business Income, which is calculated as business revenue less all business expenses.

(Business revenue minus all business expenses = Qualified Business Income)

It is important to note that total taxable income and qualified business income are different figures. Total taxable income (Adjusted Gross Income) may include other deductions that are not related to your Qualified Business Income.

Therefore, even if your Qualified Business Income is greater than \$157,500 (single filing), if your Adjusted Gross Income (amount after all business and personal deductions) is less than this amount, you still receive a 20% deduction from the total of your Qualified Business Income.

Review Your Investment Objective

Periodically reviewing your investments to ensure they are on the right track is an important and meaningful measure in working toward your financial goals. Here is a simple but valuable way to get more from your investment strategy. When your next brokerage statement arrives, check your account profile to make sure that all the sections are accurate and up to date. This includes your investment objective, risk tolerance, and time horizon.

Investment objective. Focusing on your investment objectives helps us align the other parts of your investment strategy – risk tolerance, time horizon, and liquidity needs – appropriately. Our asset allocation models are grouped within three overarching portfolio orientations:

Income: Portfolios that emphasize current income with minimal consideration for capital appreciation. They usually have less exposure to historically more volatile growth assets.

Growth and Income: Portfolios that emphasize a blend of current income and capital appreciation. They usually have some exposure to historically more volatile growth assets.

Growth: Portfolios that emphasize capital appreciation with minimal consideration for current income. They usually have significant exposure to historically more volatile growth assets.

Risk tolerance. Everyone is different when it comes to factoring risk into their investment strategy. Each investment objective can be tilted toward assets that tend to be more or less volatile. Risk tolerance is the amount of risk you're willing and able to accept in order to help achieve your financial goals. Risk tolerance should be viewed along the following continuum:

Conservative investors accept the lowest amount of risk.

Moderate investors seek a balance between stability and appreciation in their portfolio.

Aggressive investors accept a higher risk for losses while seeking greater potential for returns.

Time horizon. How long do you plan to invest before you'll need the money? The answer, of course, depends on your stage in life and your goals. Your time horizon is the expected number of months, years, or decades you plan to invest toward your financial goals. Time horizon is generally

expressed as:

Immediate – Less than 1 year

Short-term -1 to 3 years

Intermediate – 3 to 5 years

Moderate – 5 to 10 years

Long-term – More than 10 years

When checking your portfolio's alignment, it's also a good idea to make sure you've accounted for your liquidity needs. Liquidity measures the ease with which you can meet financial obligations with your available liquid assets. For reference, cash is the most liquid asset, while real

estate, fine art, and collectibles are all relatively illiquid. Liquidity needs include:

Significant (primary need is liquidity)

Moderate (may need quick access to cash)

None (have other sources of cash)

When building your portfolio, it can be tricky to figure out if you're getting the best return for your risk level. Talk with your financial advisor to make sure your strategy is on track to help achieve your goals.

Ohio BWC Proposes \$1.5 Billion Back

Gov. John R. Kasich joined BWC Administrator/CEO Sarah Morrison to propose giving Ohio employers \$1.5 billion in premium rebates this summer, expanding workers' comp. savings for employers to \$8 billion since 2011.

"We've had healthy income and returns on our investment portfolio, and it's only right to share that success with our private and public employers," said Morrison, standing with Kasich at the Land-Grant Brewing Co. in downtown Columbus. "We know that the more money we leave with employers, the more they can invest in their employees and grow their business."

Added Kasich: "This is another example of how Ohio is using every tool in the box to make our environment for job creation one of the best in the nation, and our workers' compensation system has been a great partner in our efforts. We're up 500,000 private sector jobs and these additional savings in workers compensation costs will continue to help our businesses grow and succeed."

The proposed rebate equals 85 percent of the premiums paid for the policy year that ended June 30, 2017 (calendar year 2016 for public employers). The rebate, BWC's largest in 20 years, will be presented to BWC's Board of Directors Wednesday, April 25, and voted on at the board's May 24 meeting. If approved, rebate checks would likely be mailed in July and August.
