

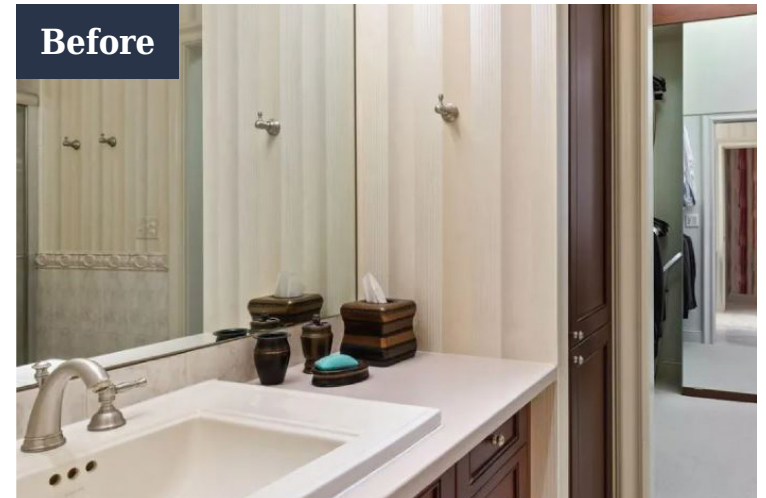
Woodside Bathroom



This homeowner wanted a home on Lake Minnetonka. They knew they wanted a remodel rather than new build based on costs. The floor plan of the home was choppy, and the style was outdated but offered the opportunity to create the vision they desired. By finding a home with a good exterior we could focus our efforts on interior updates.

Our goal with the home's master bathroom was to update the style and layout. By moving the bedroom to the end of the home, we were able to create a vestibule into the owner's suite leading to the bathroom, and then on to the closet at the front of the home.

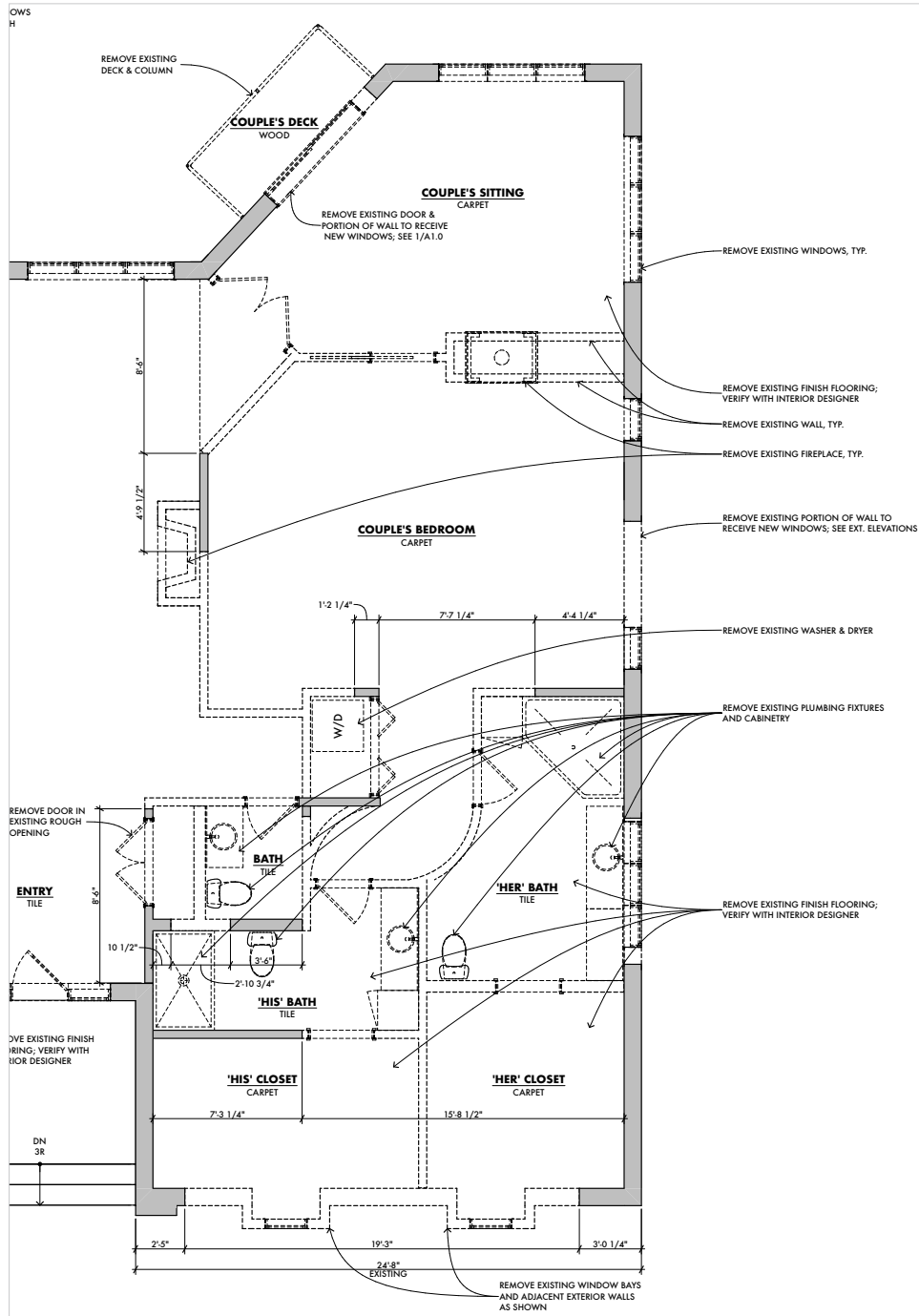

We combined the original his and hers bathrooms into one large bathroom leaving a large space to fill. The homeowners preferred simple and elegant materials to prevent the space from feeling too busy. Utilizing a blend of patterned and solid materials, we were able to break up the space visually rather than physically. The tile feature at the center of the floor leads the eye to a stunning full height porcelain slab behind the soaker tub.

Additional unique features include a hidden TV in the bathroom cabinetry, and duo toned cabinet finishes that provide a classic, yet interesting look to the space highlighting the center vanity with a walnut stain.

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
