

ABOUT THE PROJECT







BEFORE FLOOR PLAN




SCOPE OF WORK

- Remove old millwork













FUNCTIONALITY


- Closed storage for towels and soaps

- Outlets inside of cabinetry for concealed charging/plugins










- Millwork matched to existing home casing
















AESTHETICS







OBSTACLES

The bathroom is located on the side of the home on the second story; making it hard to access since the ground below slopes down into a pond towards the back of the home. We knew we would need to get creative when replacing this window. We rented a telescoping boom lift which helped lift the window into place as well as provided safety on ice during a winter install. Fun Fact: The boom lift rental cost matched the cost of the window itself.
