This client came to us with an 80-square-foot kitchen that was in dire need of updating. They wanted to maintain the original flair of this classic home during the remodel and did not want us to change the size of the kitchen.

Considering just how small this kitchen is, utilizing wall space was the best option to create more storage and more counterspace. As we got started, we exposed years of failing repairs. The electrical, HVAC, and plumbing was completely reworked.

We added fresh finishes to the space including fresh customenameled cabinets, quartz countertops, new lighting, new Anderson windows, and a stone tile backsplash.





- OPTION OUT: INSTALL NEW TILE ON LANDING.






FUNCTIONALITY:

- > Rev-a-shelf components to utilize all cabinet space
- > Used smaller, high-end appliances to save space
- > Relocating the sink/plumbing to change the layout
- > Custom cabinetry to utilize every inch of the space
- Changing the overall window height to allow for the current kitchen layout





CRAFTSMANSHIP/INNOVATIVE METHODS/AESTHETICS:

- > Custom enameled cabinetry
- > Pull outs, roll outs, and Rev-a-Shelf components
- > A soffit is hidden within cabinetry over the stove.
- > Quartz countertops
- > New lighting
- New Andersen windows
- > Custom stone backsplash
- Original maple floors were salvaged, pieced in where needed, and refinished
- > All updated wiring, HVAC, and plumbing
- All new millwork was matched to existing 1920s millwork throughout the home.

PROJECT CHALLENGES:

- > Work within tight budget
- > Size of the space

- Unforeseen plumbing, electrical, and HVAC issues after exposing years of failing repairs after multiple remodels (not done by us)
- Designing a fully functioning kitchen within 80-squarefeet
