
AESTHETICS





The black paver patio, IPE wood, and Fon du Lac wall materials were specifically selected for complementary colors to the house stone and siding.

Large paver steppers were laid in synthetic turf to add a softer touch to the underdeck area.



The front of the home has an incredible view through the doors all the way to the lake so the clients wanted enhance the experience as visitors walked up to the door. The exterior space was also visible from inside through the many surrounding windows. An exterior fireplace was built with the house, so a seat wall was added to create a cozy, intimate seating area.












The clients wanted a walk out basement which was very difficult with the existing grade.

By expanding the retaining walls out more to create a sunken area, the clients were able to walk out of the basement doors and right into the space. It's cozy and functional, yet also allows the view to the lake to be unobstructed.







CRAFTMANSHIP

- All the carpentry elements were expertly designed for this very specific space.
- The vaulted hot tub was a creative decision made by the designer to utilize the underdeck space and allow for more patio area by the basement doors.
- The steps down from the upper deck area were constructed on top of a concrete wall that supports the wood frame. Each step acts as stadium seating for the hot tub as well as functioning as a way down to the lower lawn.

KEY FEATURES

- Custom curved IPE deck
- Fon du Lac retaining walls
- Techo-Bloc black pavers
- Sunken yard for walk out basement
- Travertine patio
- IPE hot tub vault and bench with storage





The outline of the sunken entertaining space is the exact boundary of the lake shore setback, so we used every possible inch.

Since decks do not count as hardcover in this municipality, the curved deck is on top of a drainage swale and stormwater drainage area that drains into the lake.

The lower lawn area was graded so that all water runs to the drainage system under the deck instead of visibly pooling in the yard. A creative variation on the standard rain garden!
